JUNE MAGAZINES.

THE NATIONAL.

War news appears to have absorbed pretty much of everything during the past month. "The National Magazine" of Boston for June responds enthusiastically to the public mood, with a special war number. It is altogether a superb effort.

The cover page in national colors represents a timely naval scene. The frontispiece gives a scene on board an American man-of-war, manning a ten inch gun at the battle of Manila. The companion piece is Hunt's famous painting, "The Trumpeter."

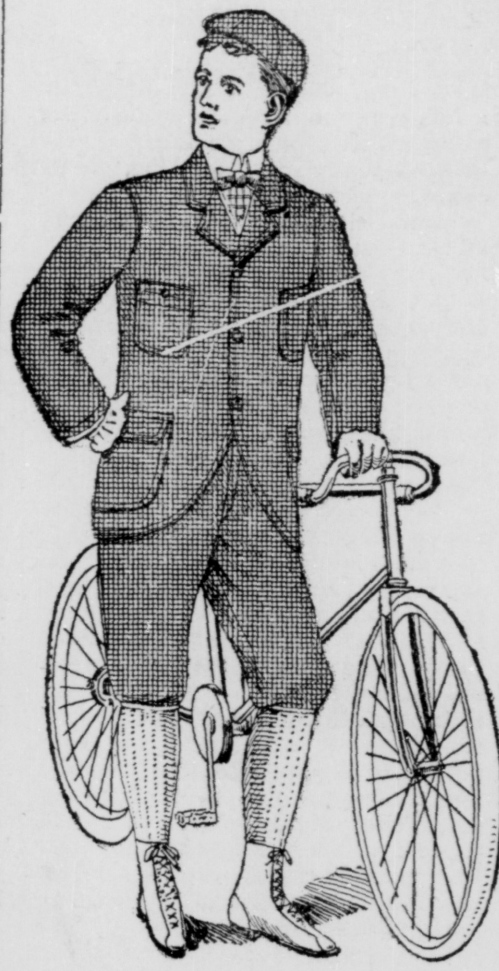
Patriotism is enthroned on every page of this issue. The "Outburst of Patriotic Sentiment" describes the blaze of enthusiasm in the hall of Congress which welded the ties of national unity and marked an epoch in history. The notable changes in "Naval and Army Revolution" since 1861 are interestingly described and the legal procedure in reference to prize money reveals that there has been but little change in this since 1812. "The Origin of the Stars and Stripes," illustrated by the famous Weisgerber painting is a most timely subject. "Memorable Scenes in our First Congress" is a dramatic and timely historical narrative giving the real incidents and atmosphere of the times when the United States had then first diplomatic brush with Spain. "War Times at the White House" is also a timely sketch, and "The Naval Militia" is an article of great importance, as it is the first time it has ever been described fully in public print. "Heroism on the Battlefield" is a popular and stirring bit of literature at this time, and is illustrated from famous naval and land battle paintings. "The American Volunteer" is another illustrated article showing the various uniforms, the manner and method of recruiting volunteers for the American army since the days of the minute men in 1775. Walt Whitman's "Song of the Banner at Daybreak" appears for the first time in a periodical, and stirring recollections are also awakened by the publication of Bayard Taylor's "Song of the Camp." Freeman Furbish's sketch, "A Fellow and a Fool," is in his most charming vein and adds a well-defined bit of sunshine to the grim description of war times and incidents.

The usual quota of excellent short stories and departments is maintained, and all through this number is maintained a high-spirited and enthusiastic patriotism.

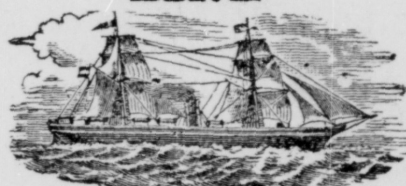
