**2,500,000 To Vote In Quebec June 20 Election**

QUEBEC (CP)—Some 2,500,000 persons are expected to be eligible to go to the polls June 20 to elect a new provincial legislature. After two days of cabinet sessions, Premier Duplessis Wednesday announced the dissolution of the 24th legislature, elected in 1952. Mr. Duplessis will be seeking a fourth successive mandate for his Union Nationale party. Enumeration of voters will begin May 14 and nominations for the 93 seats will close June 6. Final formalities of getting the electoral machinery into action were completed only a few hours after Mr. Duplessis told a score of newspaper reporters in the cabinet chamber that the election date was set.

**WON LAST THREE**  
The election will be the sixth since Mr. Duplessis fused his Conservatives with break-away Liberals and Nationalists to defeat a Liberal administration that had been in power from 1897 to 1936. His first government went down to defeat in 1939 after three years of administration. Re-elected in 1944 on a provincial rights platform, his party won the 1948 and 1952 elections.

For the 66-year old Trois-Rivieres bachelor lawyer the election will be his 10th as legislature member for his hometown riding, his fourth as premier.

Standing at dissolution was: Union Nationale, 64; Liberals, 22; Independent, one; vacant, five; total, 92.

The 93 ridings at stake represent an increase from 92 in the 1952 provincial election. The new seat is Kenogami-Jonquiere, formerly part of Chicoutimi, in the Lake St. John region.

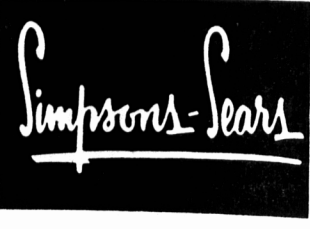

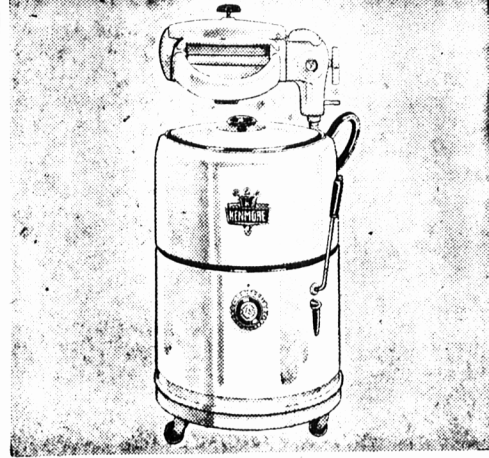

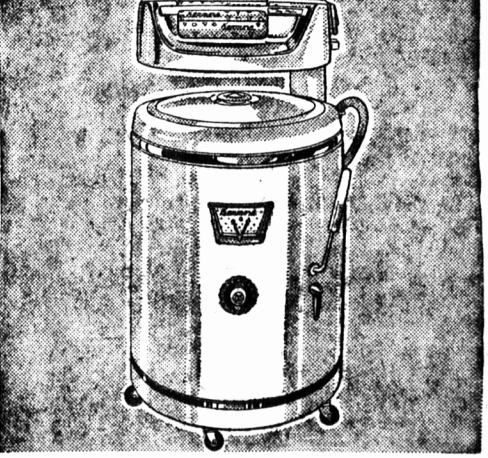
