Inquest Is Held In Death Of S' side Man In Trench Cave-in

A coroner's jury, empaneled by Coroner Dr. E. Callaghan to inquire into the cause of death of William Clements, aged 72 years, who died as a result of injuries sustained while working in a trench at the Crystal Dairy on East street on December 3rd, met last night and heard evidence from four persons.

The first witness was Mr. Alfred Groom, engineer of the Summerside Water Department who testified that the deceased had been employed as a labourer with the department and been engaged on the trench of his death in digging a trench for water pipes on East Street. He said that the sides of the trench had been braced to prevent a cave-in and that the braces had been removed that morning, presumably by the workmen themselves for greater ease in laying the pipes.

Leo Arsenault, who was working with Clements in the ditch at the time said that the braces had been removed because they felt that the ground was sufficiently frozen to prevent the sides from caving in.

Evidence was also taken from Mr. Allison Harris, who had been working in a house nearby and from Constable Elmer Matheson of the town police who described the efforts made and the difficulties which had been encountered in removing the heavy block of frozen clay and loose earth which covered the deceased.

The jury, after deliberation on the evidence, brought in a verdict that the deceased had met his death as a result of a cave-in of the sides of the trench in which he was working, causing compression injuries to his chest and lungs resulting in his death.
