Local and Other Items.

A FATAL ACCIDENT—William Jefferson, aged 65, a well-to-do farmer of Northwest Arm, Cape Breton, fell off a load of hay last Thursday afternoon while at work on his farm and was killed. He leaves a wife and family.

BURNS MONUMENT—A Burns monument was unveiled at Barre, Vermont, a short while ago, surmounted by a life size statue of the poet, made and contributed by William Barclay, an Aberdeenshire man, who came to America in 1835, as a journeyman and is now at the head of one of the largest manufacturing concerns in the world.

REMEDY FOR TUBERCULOSIS—A new remedy for tuberculosis comes from France. It consists in the daily injection into the bronchial tubes of essence of eucalyptus, thym and cinnamon, held in a solution of olive oil. The oil in descending slowly comes in contact with the walls of the tube and upper lungs. The gas set free saturates the air in the lungs and acts upon the mucous membranes. In sixteen cases treated, after one or two weeks there was in all a lessening or complete cessation of the cough and expectoration, as well as a return of sleep, appetite and strength.

THE ANGELUS—The latest thing in the musical line is the Angelus, one of which a member of the EXAMINER staff saw in operation at Miller Bros. showroom to-day. The Angelus may be attached to any piano or used separately as an organ. It is not necessary that the operator should have a knowledge of music, the Angelus will strike the keys of the piano exactly as the composer intended and the expression is completely under the player's control. In appearance it is a small cabinet of hand-ome design, containing two full sets of reeds, of five octaves each, orchestra voiced. The cabinet can be placed in any part of the house, and when away from the piano is a powerful self-playing organ in itself. When it is desired to play the piano the cabinet is rolled into position in front of the instrument, the panels are folded back, and the openings in the case allow the cabinet to slide under the keyboard. When in position a series of levers or fingers project over the tops of the keys. These fingers will operate the keys of the piano in the same manner as the hand, and are operated by a stop. The pedals of the piano are also operated by levers placed conveniently for the hands, the combinations obtainable include piano, organ, violin, flute and voice, the entire power of both piano and organ is brought out by the same roll of music. The contrivance is a complete one, and well worthy of inspection.

IMPORTANT DISCOVERY

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—Dr. E. W. Allen, assistant director of experimental stations in the agricultural department, has just returned from a prolonged tour of the west, made for the purpose of inspecting the various stations in that section of the country. He states that one of the most interesting lines of investigation which is being made in these sections is that with regard to cheese making. The station in Wisconsin is taking the lead in this especial work and discoveries have been made there which will revolutionize the European theory that ripening of cheese is due to bacteria. The American experiments demonstrate beyond doubt that the principal change in the albuminoids which takes place in the ripening process is dependent upon a ferment which is contained in the milk itself, and not owing to the bacteria. It is said this discovery will have an important bearing upon cheese manufacturing in the future.
