

Colts Seek Western Title In Tilt With Rams Today

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The football spotlight centers on Los Angeles today when the champion Baltimore Colts seek to sew up the western division title of the National Football League.

Quarterback Johnny Unitas and his mates are 12-point favorites to defeat the luckless Los Angeles Rams and send the Colts into the championship battle with New York Giants for the second straight year.

The Colts have not beaten the Rams in Memorial Coliseum since 1954, and only once since 1950. But Green Bay Packers had not won here since 1947 and they turned the trick, rather easily, last Sunday.

Despite the Rams' poorest season ever in Los Angeles, nine losses and only two wins, a crowd of around 60,000 is expected.

Baltimore must win. Otherwise, they might have to contend in a playoff with the San Francisco 49ers.

Yanks, Athletics Complete Deal

NEW YORK (AP)—The New York Yankees Friday obtained outfielder Roger Maris and gave up Don Larsen in a seven-player trade with the Kansas City Athletics.

The Athletics, who have made numerous previous transactions with the Yanks, also received outfielders Norm Siebern and Hank Bauer and first baseman - outfielder Marv Throneberry.

In addition to Maris, the Yanks got shortstop Joe Demaestri and first baseman Kent Hadley. The deal nullified a New York player obligation resulting from last summer's trade in which Hector Lopez moved to New York.

The Yanks also announced they had signed outfielder Elmer Valo, a free agent. Valo played part of last season with Cleveland.

The Sunday slate of games includes Green Bay at San Francisco and Detroit at Chicago. New York already has won the eastern division title and closes

out the regular campaign Sunday against the Redskins at Washington.

The remainder of the schedule: Cleveland Brown at Philadelphia, and Chicago Cardinals at Pittsburgh.

Cosch Weeb Ewbank, who brought the Colts into town from San Francisco, made it plain he is not taking the Rams lightly. "There isn't an easy team in fully capable of registering an upset on any given afternoon."

Sid Gillman, whose five-year tenure as headman of the Rams is in a precarious state, said he could only hope for a few breaks. The Rams have not enjoyed too many this season.

Los Angeles lost to Baltimore back east Nov. 29, 35-21.
