

ENOSIS IN SCHOOLS

Blame British For Letting Greek Propaganda Spread

KYRENIA, Cyprus (CP) —The overwhelming Greek Cypriot majority in Cyprus looks on the island's union with Greece as an act of faith, and this almost religious fanaticism to their ideal has been instilled in them from childhood.

With this deep-seated attitude, the problems of the Cyprus revolt seem almost insoluble. Military men see these alternatives. Continuation of the costly and frustrating police action, or a compromise short of union with Greece that might win the Greek Cypriots' grudging acceptance.

"I frankly wouldn't hazard an opinion as to what should be done and I certainly don't want to be quoted," said Air Commodore A. J. (Tony) Shelton of Summerside, P.E.I., a Canadian in the RAF.

We had just arrived at Shelton's billet here after a drive through rebel-infested mountainous roads from the capital, Nicosia. As we pulled up before the Shelton home, the Canadian officer got friendly waves from his Greek neighbors.

His attractive wife Pat, an English girl, came along the narrow street without protection and without fear. Like the wives of other servicemen she moves in comparative safety except with their husbands, who are prime ECKA targets.

All servicemen carry revolvers at all times and when they go out at night most of them use shoulder holsters and automatics as a matter of comfort and convenience.

The trouble is that most of our poor chaps have been shot in the back and never had a chance to fire," said the air commodore. (C)ED CAUSE

British tolerance in allowing the Greek majority full cultural and economic freedom is given by some as the chief reason why the movement is seemingly so strong now.

"Why, the British haven't even protested the Greek teaching of geography in the schools here, which has taken liberty with the location of Cyprus," said Mrs. Shelton. The Greek Cypriot maps show the island practically nudging Greece whereas it is actually 50 miles away from the Greek mainland.

It's only 40 miles from Turkey and 80 from Lebanon. You can see the snowy peaks of the Turkish coastal range from the Shelton living room.

While the Sheltons' neighbors are obviously warmly friendly this doesn't mean they haven't definite views about Enosis (union with Greece). I didn't meet one Greek Cypriot, even among the more moderate who showed anything but sympathy toward the movement, though some were extremely cautious.

Wide support "Sure it's the younger people who are carrying on the fight but I think there is universal support for what they're doing," said a Greek at a newsstand.

"All I can say," said Mrs. Shelton, "is that when a bomb is thrown in the market place nobody ever sees anything or knows anything about it." And her husband feels that this isn't just a case of fear of retaliation.

Many of the Greeks I met were taxi drivers. And you could see the deep resentment they felt over the undisciplined searches at the check points. Having talked moderately about the situation they were sensitive about the search and walking out of sight behind their ears to suffer the thorough frisking.

MEANINGLESS SEARCH Meantime the unrelenting search continues in the night. A attempt to flush out the main leaders. When the Sheltons drove this correspondent back to the hotel we saw a demonstration of the British house-raiding system. Is Committed On Murder Charge

DALHOUSIE, N.B. (CP) — The three-day preliminary hearing of Joseph Pierre Richard, charged with murdering Katherine De La Perriere, 13, ended Friday when Magistrate J. T. Troy committed him for trial.

The 30-year-old laborer, father of two children, will be tried at the Supreme Court session opening April 23.

Cluny Reid of Charlottetown testified Friday he saw Richard wearing a station wagon coat at 10:03 p.m. Feb. 9. That was shortly before the girl disappeared while returning home from a neighborhood visit at Charlottetown.

According to evidence she was attacked, beaten and strangled. Her body was found in snow the next day.

A chemist testified that fuzz and fibres on a station wagon coat and suit coat, alleged to have been owned by Richard, came from a sweater the girl wore. A police witness said the station wagon coat, on which the chemist said blood was detected, was found in the Charlottetown area.

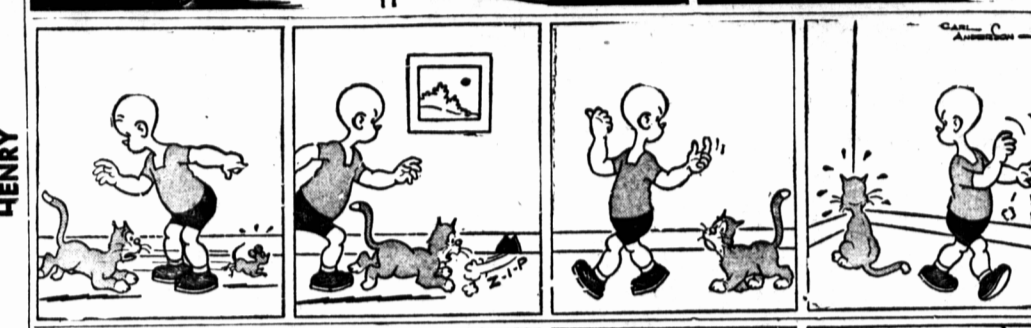

It has always seemed to this writer that of the three departments of bridge—bidding, dummy play and defense—the most interesting one is defense. Personal observation also indicates that more mistakes are made by the average bridge player in defending a hand than in either of the other departments.

One of the chief reasons for this hard fact is that there are relatively few guiding principles to point the way to proper defense.

The defender is more or less on his own because the pattern of correct defense varies greatly from deal to deal. The infinite variety of situations that arise repeatedly challenge his skill and ingenuity.

East contrived to find the proper defense in the accompanying hand to defeat a contract which, at first glance, appears to be a cut and dried affair. His problem came after he had won two heart tricks and the question was what to play next.

All that East had to guide him was the bidding sequence which led to the four spade contract and the fact that West had started with a doubleton heart.

The first step was to peg the high cards that were not in sight. The ace of spades, ace-king of diamonds and the ace of clubs were missing. It didn't seem likely that South had all of them, since he would presumably have made an infernal trump double with such strength rather than a mere spade overcall.

One trick was therefore credited to West. If he didn't have it, there was no hope to beat the hand anyhow. The second defensive trick, the setting one, could come only from the trump suit. This one probably did not exist naturally, but had to be manufactured.

So East led another heart, South followed suit. West trumped with the five, dummy with the jack, and there was then no way for declarer to escape the loss of a trump and the ace of diamonds.

A little five-spot did the trick.
