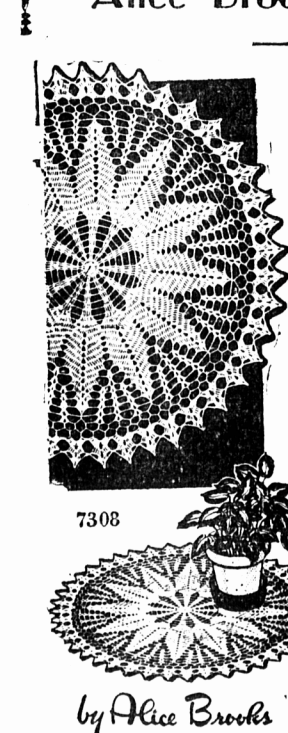

KITCHEN RAIDERS

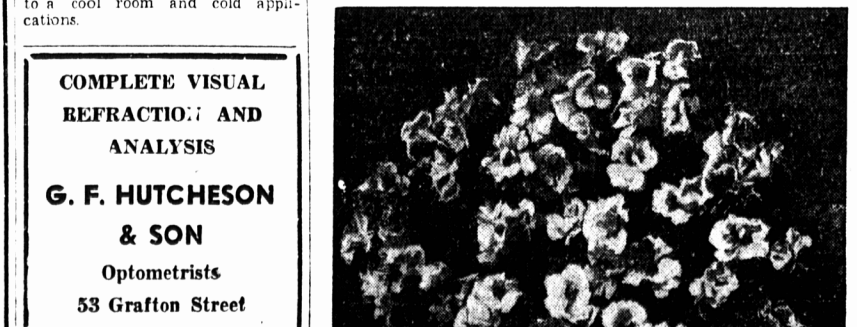

Cook's Corner

ORANGE, PINEAPPLE AND STRAWBERRY JAM

3 1/2 cups prepared fruit 6 cups sugar 1/2 bottle liquid pectin Grate rind and squeeze juice from 3 medium oranges and one medium lemon. Pare 1 medium, fully ripe pineapple and chop very fine or grind. Crush 1 pint strawberries. Combine rind juices and fruits and measure 3 1/2 cups into very large saucepan.

Add sugar to fruit, mix well. Bring to full rolling boil, boil hard 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and stir in liquid pectin at once. Then skim and stir by turns for 5 minutes, to cool slightly and prevent floating fruit. Ladle quickly into glasses. Paraffin at once. Make about 10, six ounce glasses.

because it will not flower well in hot weather. The new double fringed varieties are covered with flowers in California, along the coast, where winds from the ocean keep temperatures down. But when grown in the full sun in high temperatures they are often reluctant to bloom. Light shade will keep the temperature down and stimulate their bloom, but it must be light, such as is cast by oak trees, and not the total shade cast by buildings.

In selecting flowers to grow for cutting, be sure to have some blue flowers, as well as yellow, orange, pink and red. Blue is always needed to balance the color scheme in flower arrangements to be used indoors, and it is also needed in the garden where there is usually an over-abundance of red and yellow flowers, for the best effect. Ageratum, centaurea cyanus, her-very blue morning glory, scabiosa, and asters give excellent blue flowers. All these can be grown from seed now.
