Plan Investigation Of Nfld. Resources

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. April 1-
An extensive investigation of Newfoundland's water, forest and mineral resources will be carried out during 1950, described as the Province's year of development, Premier Smallwood told the Legislature.
Specifically, he said forest stands of Labrador, the water power of the south coast and the mines of the Notre Dame Bay area would come under investigation.
Speaking during the Throne Speech debate, Mr. Smallwood said it had been proven Labrador had 50,000 cords of standing pulpwood.
He did not say how much the investigations would cost.
" It is hoped," he said, "that the investigation will prove that it would be possible to combine Labrador timber and south coast water power for a mill producing newsprint, sulphite pulp or bleach sulphate for fine papers. Such a mill would probably be situated at Arrol's Cove or Southern Harbor on the Avalon Peninsula.
Investigations would also be carried out to see if any other product could be made, using the water power in the south coast area. A seaport might be developed there, perhaps a national harbour. Under consideration also was the possibility of a refinery to process the ores of Buchans, in the interior of the island, and also any other minerals which might be found.
The mineral survey would be made from the air and would cover from the bottom of Notre Dame Bay from the sea south to the railway line. Such a survey would cost about \$200,000 and tentative arrangements have already been made.

Says Gov't Considering Plans For Employment

OTTAWA, April 1 - (CP) -
The Canadian Congress of Labor, voice of 300,000 workers, yesterday accused the Government of trying to minimize Canada's unemployment and of having no program to deal with it.
Its annual submission to the Cabinet brought from Prime Minister St. Laurent the statement that although more Canadians are employed at better wages than ever before more employment opportunities have got to be developed to keep pace with a growing population.
This, he said, is a question "of very serious concern" to the Government. But it was "not entirely without policies" to meet joblessness.

The Congress, charging that more than 10 per cent of actual "paid workers" now are out of jobs came out with a planned seven-point program by the Government to sustain not only a high but an increasing level of employment, to increase consumption "and keep it increasing as fast as our productive power."
" Our labor force is constantly increasing and our industry is becoming steadily more efficient," the Congress said. "... Unless we can raise our standard of living far enough and fast enough to keep pace with the growth in the labor force and in productivity per man unemployment will continue to rise."

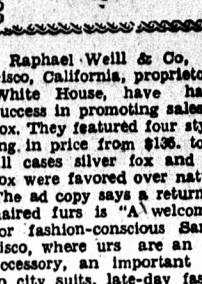

TIMELY NOTES ON TOPICS CONNECTED WITH Silver Fox and Mink Farming



Raphael Weill & Co., San Francisco, California, proprietors of the White House, have had great success in promoting sales of silver fox. They featured four styles ranging in price from \$138. to \$336. In all cases silver fox and platinum fox were favored over natural blue. The ad copy says a return of long-haired furs is "A welcome return for fashion-conscious San Francisco, where furs are an accepted accessory, an important addenda to city suits, late-day fashions."

All types of furs will be offered between now and the end of April at auctions in the United States and Canada. Ranch mink sales which were cancelled by most companies by mutual agreement during the month of March, will be resumed this month. On April 4th the 7th New York Auction Company, general fur ranch and mutation mink fur Auction Vancouver, general sales; April 11-13-14, Lampson, Fraser & Huth's, New York, all types of furs including silver fox; April 14, Montreal Fur Sales (Canada) Ltd., April 17, Hudson's Bay Company, Montreal, general sale of furs; April 24, Canadian Fur Auction Sales (Quebec) Ltd., Montreal, general sale of furs; April 27-28, Lampson, Fraser & Huth, New York, ranch mink.

We have received from J. Ferguson Grant, Assistant Director Publicity Division, Department of Trade and Commerce, Ottawa, a very attractive booklet entitled "Canadian Furs." It was prepared in collaboration with W.M. Ritchie, Department of Agriculture for distribution at the fair section of the Milan International Trade Fair which opens on April 12th. On page 1 is the Canadian Coat of Arms; on page 2 is a reproduction of photograph of a handsome young lady air hostess surrounded by mutation mink pelts which were flown across the Atlantic for display in Europe. They comprise Silverblu, Silverblu Breath of Spring, Pastel Breath of Spring, Kohlnur, Blu Frost, Glaciers and White mink pelts, each a specimen pelt we would judge from the illustration.

Page 3 is a reproduction of a photograph of a prize winning white mink one of the many new types being raised in Canada. This follows reading matter of which these are extracts: "Several centuries of hunting and trapping have not seriously affected the capacity of Canada's stock of fur-bearing animals make a leading contribution to the world's requirements of furs of the highest quality. The Yukon, North West Territories and other northern areas form a reservoir from which under wise methods of conservation a valuable catch may be taken in perpetuity. Canada's fur resources are being substantially supplemented by the increase of fur-bearing animals reared in captivity.
Page 4 has a photo of buyers from Europe and the United States inspecting mink in the fur sales building of the Hudson's Bay Company in Montreal, and below is the statement that 26 per cent of the value of Canada's total annual fur pelt production is derived from the mink industry which was pioneered in Canada. This successful domestication of the silver fox, mink and other fur-bearing animals of high pelt value has introduced a new and profitable branch of animal husbandry.

In the 1947-48 season 7,200,000 were taken in Canada from wild fur-bearing animals and 749,000 pelts were from fur farms. The value of the latter amounted to about 35 per cent of the aggregate value. There are about 6,000 fur farms in Canada, the most important being those raising standard and new type mink and silver and new type foxes. The booklet then goes on to describe the different types of silver fox and system of grading ranch fox pelts and how the fur trade benefits from the government grading system and explains that each pelt carries a tag attached by the government inspector of the fur inspection and grading

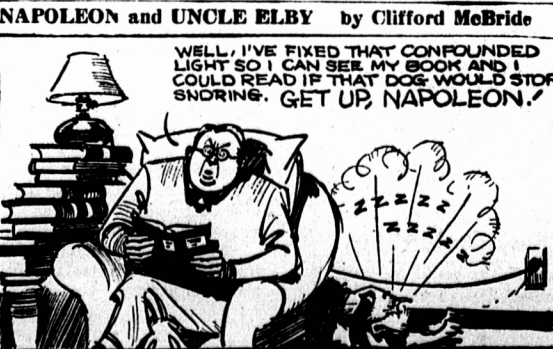
