

### Mackens Walk Off With Three Tennis Titles

TORONTO, Aug. 7 — (CP) — The Mackens of Montreal walked off Saturday with three Ontario tennis titles, and came within an ace of taking a fourth.

Brendan, oldest of the family team, took down three of the titles. He defeated brother Jimmy in the men's finals, paired with Jim for the men's doubles crown, and won the mixed doubles with sister Pat.

Pat lost out in the women's singles final to Barbara Knapp of Birmingham, England. Miss Knapp, top-seeded, won in three sets, 3-6, 5-1, 6-4.

In the feature match, Brendan downed dark-haired Jimmy 6-4, 1-6, 6-3, 6-1. Brendan's forceful attacking game finally wore down Jimmy's stubborn defence.

The Mackens swept through two pairs Saturday in annexing the men's doubles title. In the semi-finals they defeated Mel Jones and Joe Hopper of Toronto 3-6, 6-1, 1-2, and went on to down Austin Macpherson and Jim Duff of Toronto 6-1, 2-6, 6-3.

The ladies' doubles went to Miss Doris Ell and Mrs. Anne Fredhoof of Toronto, who outlasted Miss Knapp and Miriam Rainboth of Ottawa 2-6, 6-3, 9-7 in a marathon.

Brendan Macken and sister Pat displayed too many strokes for the Ottawa pair of Barney Lawrence and Pat Lowe in the mixed doubles final.

### P. C. Party Quebec Organizer

MONTREAL, Aug. 5 — Appointment of Rene Gobell as organizer of the Progressive Conservative Party in the Province of Quebec was announced last night here by George C. Nowlan, M.P. for Annapolis Kings and national president of the Progressive Conservative Party.

Mr. Gobell had been in charge of the Quebec City office of the party, an office to which he was appointed shortly after the general federal election of 1949.

The local office of the party which concerns itself with the affairs of the 47 ridings in the Montreal district has been in charge of Jean Morin, K. C., and Mrs. J. D'Neil Gallery since last December. Mr. Gobell replaces Paul Fournier who resigned some time ago to devote his time exclusively to labor matters.

Appointment of Mr. Gobell at this time was deemed advisable in view of the by-election scheduled in the Fall in the Joliette-Assomption-Montcalm riding. There will also be one in Rimouski as a result of the death last week of Gleason Belzile, M.P. for Rimouski.

#### Possible Vacancies

Other by-elections in Quebec are also possible if Gaspard Fautoux, M.P. for St. Mary, and C. H. "Chubby" Power, M.P. for Quebec South, are named to the Senate. There was a report that Mr. Fautoux might become Lieutenant-Governor of the province, but this was considered improbable as Mr. Fautoux is only 52 years of age. The Lieutenant-Governorship is usually reserved for an older man and it has been rumored at various times that a possible successor to Sir Eugene Fliset would be Chief Justice Thibodeau Rinfret of the Supreme Court of Canada. It would not be the first time that the Government has gone to the Supreme Court of Canada for a Lieutenant-Governor, this having previously happened when the late Sir Charles Fitzpatrick was appointed to Spencerwood toward the end of the First World War.

### Ukrainian Culture For Canada

SASKATOON, Aug. 7 — (CP) — Canadian artists and composers can learn a lot from Ukrainian design and Ukrainian melodies, says Madame Tetiana Koshetz.

She is touring Western Canada to tell local women's groups about Ukrainian culture, continuing a work begun by her husband, the late composer and choir leader, Dr. Alexander Koshetz.

The composer collected more than 2,000 Ukrainian folk songs, some dating back to pagan times. His widow is continuing the search and is discovering that many may be found among folk who came to Canada from the Ukraine many years ago.

These songs are valuable as material for Canadian composers, she told local women's groups. In the same way, Ukrainian ornamental art—needlework designs and unique patterns on Ukrainian Easter eggs—can act as inspirational motifs for Canadian artists.

To record and safekeep these designs and melodies, a Ukrainian cultural educational centre has been established in Winnipeg, with Madame Koshetz in charge of the library. She also conducts summer courses at the Ukrainian Youth Club in Winnipeg and on occasions conducts massed choirs.

### Bauld Brothers Win Top Honors In N. S. Tennis

WINDSOR, N. S., Aug. 7 — (CP) — Don and Gordon Bauld, Halifax brothers, carried off top honors today in the finals of the Nova Scotia tennis championship tournament.

They retained the doubles crown in three straight sets against Bev Piers and Ken Reardon 6-1, 6-3 and 6-2.

Don took the men's singles title in three sets from Blair Dunlop, Halifax, 6-2, 6-0 and 6-4.

Mrs. Jo Mitchell of Halifax and Sydney won the ladies singles in

a close match with Mrs. Anna Ross of Sydney Mines, 8-6, 7-5. Mrs. Mitchell teamed with Mrs. W. H. Woodbury, Halifax, to cop the ladies doubles from Vida Large and Gwen Dunlop, Halifax, 9-7 and 7-5.

In the mixed doubles, Mr. and Mrs. Blair Dunlop defeated Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Hughes, Windsor, 2-6, 6-4 and 7-5.

STRASBOURG, France, Aug. 7 — (Reuters) — A handshake between Winston Churchill and a German today symbolized Germany's re-entry to the family of European countries as a member of the Consultative Assembly of the Council of Europe. Cameras recorded the scene as the German, Dr. Hermann Fuender, greeted Churchill. Dr. Fuender heads the 18-man West-German delegation.

Iris Bliss was a triple winner. She defeated Nancy White, of Belmont, 6-4, 6-3 to take the women's singles crown. Miss Bliss teamed with Burt Simpson to eliminate P. Armstrong, Saint John, and John Russell, Rothesay, 6-0, 6-2 in the mixed doubles final. The women's doubles championship went to Miss Bliss and Pam McCreedy with an 8-6, 6-1 win over J. Vey and E. Forbes, Fredericton.

Simpson and Jim Crockett captured the men's doubles by defeating Jim Streeter and Elmer Pul-

dington, Rothesay, 6-2, 6-2.

Russell was the only non-Fredricton winner of the tournament. He gained the men's singles title Friday by trimming Streeter 6-0, 6-4, 6-2.

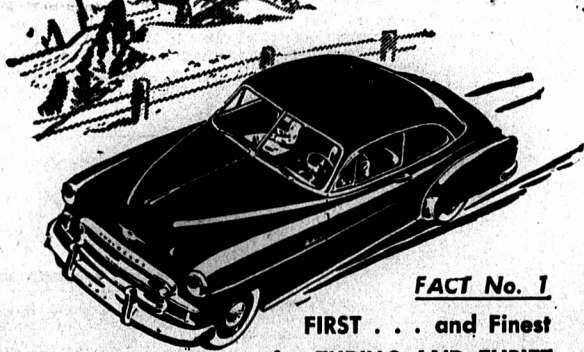

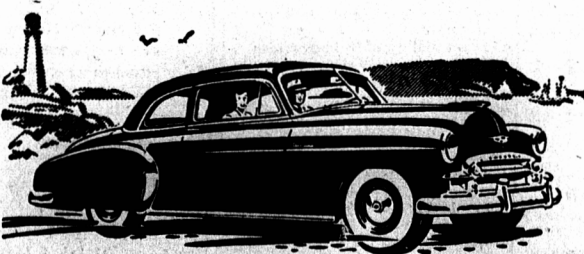
