OBITUARY

It is with the deepest regret that we chronicle the death of Allan McDonald, Esq., which sad event took place at his home, Lakeville, Lot 47.

On Thursday morning, the 31st ult., his mortal remains, followed by a large concourse of people—the funeral cortege numbering upwards of sixty carriages, Protestant joining in with Catholic to do honor to the dead—were conveyed to the church of St. Columba, where a High Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Pastor, Rev. A. J. McIntyre, thence to the cemetery adjoining and gently laid away.

He leaves two sons, three daughters, one brother and three sisters to mourn their loss.

MT. STEWART NOTES.



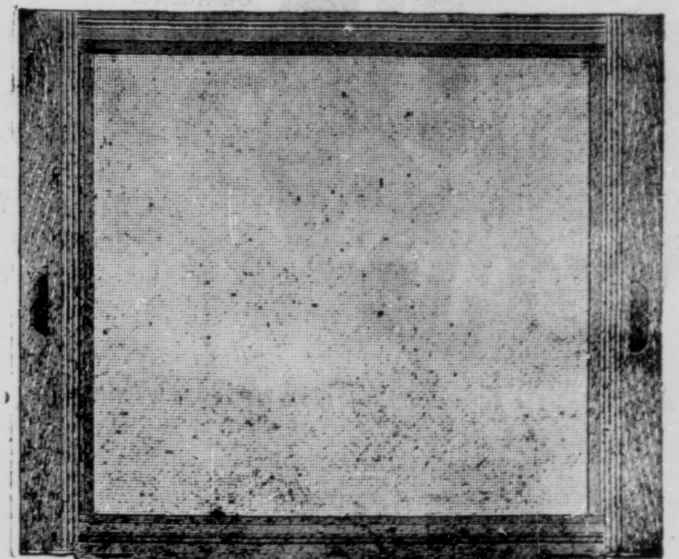
