

The Phoenix Park Murderers.

T. C. Carey, a member of the corporation of Dublin; Joseph Brady, a stone cutter; Edward O'Brien, a shoemaker; Edward McCaffery, a van driver; Peter Carey, a mason; Lawrence Hanlon, a carpenter; Peter Doyle, a coach builder; eight of the men recently arrested in Dublin were charged at the investigation on the 3rd inst., with the murder of Lord Frederick Cavendish and Mr. Burke in Phoenix Park. Great excitement was visible among occupants of the densely crowded court rooms when the eight prisoners were placed in the dock. There was a painful pause when witness Fitzsimons was called, the prisoners in the meantime shook hands with each other and joked among themselves, nodding to their friends. The clerk of the court then read the charge against the prisoners: That they did, on the 6th of May 1882, feloniously kill and slay Lord Frederick Cavendish and Thomas Henry Burke. The reading of the charge was greeted by the prisoners with a burst of loud laughter, which created a sensation in the court. Fitzsimons continued his testimony as follows: The rifle and two knives were found among a lot of rubbish; they were not much concealed. A fortnight afterwards he went to the police and delivered up the knives and rifle. Amid intense excitement, Inspector Smith produced two long blade dissecting knives, evidently as sharp as razors, and a Snider rifle, which is quite new. The knives were eagerly examined by the magistrates. While this was proceeding, there was a shade of uneasiness visible among the prisoners. In support of the evidence against Carey, Dr. Parter, Surgeon to the Queen, deposed that the cuts in the clothes and wounds of Lord Cavendish and Mr. Bourke were inflicted by instruments similar to those produced in court. The Marquis of Hereford, Mr. Jenkinson, Director of the Irish criminal investigation department, and Mr. Harrell, Chief Commissioner of Dublin police, were among those present in court. Witness Fitzsimons deposed that James Carey sometimes visited the loft where the knives were found. A chairmaker named Hands identified O'Brien as one of the four men lying near to the scene of the murder and Brady as being close by shortly before it was perpetrated. Dr. Miles deposed that some of the wounds of Cavendish and of Burke corresponded exactly to the knives produced. A despatch from Dublin says it is believed the government has accepted the evidence of men engaged in the Phoenix Park plot. The ranger of the park has resigned his position. He is under police protection. He is not sure that he can identify more than two of the prisoners. There was a hitch in the signalling along the park at the time of the murder, caused by one of the men appointed to signal neglecting to wave his handkerchief. It is believed this man has since been killed because of supposed treachery. It is stated that the police discovered and frustrated a plot to murder Judge O'Brien last Sunday.
