Catholics vs. Jews.

The "Palestine Association of German Catholics," which has for its objects the protection and furtherance of the Roman Catholic cause in the East, more especially in Palestine, resolved at its annual meeting to do its utmost to stop the further immigration of Jews into the Promise Land.

From statistics prepared for the society it appears that there are 80,000 Jews in Jerusalem alone. The census taken by the Turkish Government only gives between 12,000 and 20,000 - a discrepancy which is accounted for by the reluctance of the Jews to be registered.

Another and more important resolution was to the effect "that the holy mission of taking the foremost place in the world in protecting the Catholic cause now devolved upon the German Catholics. This duty had formerly been the pride and glory of France; but since the war that country had trampled upon this privilege, and the holy father now looked to his German children for protection."

The association is directed by some of the most influential nobles of Germany, and the declaration here quoted is believed to be the result of direct inspiration from Rome.
