Conference of Prime Ministers To End Today

LONDON (Reuters)—Commonwealth prime ministers will end a 10-day conference here today with a communique crystallizing their long private talks on the impact of recent changes in the Soviet Union on having on the international situation, conference sources said.

GERMANY STILL DIVIDED

In its reference to the situation in Europe, the communique will regret that the peaceful reunification of Germany through free elections has not yet taken place, the sources said.

NUCLEAR ENERGY

Other topics to be dealt with by the communique are: 1. The advances made in the application of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes.

July 4 Death Toll At 253

CHICAGO (AP)—The one-day observance of Fourth of July, held in the United States brought violent death to 253 persons—137 of them in traffic accidents.

A final tabulation showed 77 persons were drowned and 39 died from miscellaneous causes.

Jordan Accuses Israel Of New Territory Violations

AMMAN, Jordan (Reuters)—Jordan Thursday accused Israel of three separate ground and air violations of her territory and lodged complaints with the United Nations mixed armistice commission.

1. Israeli jet fighter planes and propeller-driven bombers flew into Jordan air space.

2. An Israeli patrol opened fire with machine-guns on Jordanian militia patrolling the frontier village of Romania in the Nabulus area. The fire was returned in a 10-minute engagement in which one Jordanian was wounded.

3. Israeli troops started a grass fire in the no man's land village of Habla and spread it deliberately into Jordan territory.
