Spud Growers Reap Harvest In Wake Of U.S. Shortage

A shortage of potatoes in the United States is giving Canadian farmers one of their best markets for the vegetable in 13 years.

The U.S. shortage has resulted in increased imports from Canada. This, in turn, has resulted in reduced supply in Canada and the potato growers are reaping a harvest of sharply higher prices.

From the consumer viewpoint, the picture is not so bright — they're paying up to nearly five times more than they did a year ago in Lethbridge, Alta.

Stocks of potatoes now are about 10 per cent lower in Canada than at this time last year, says D. W. Ware, chief of the commodity analysis section, marketing and trade services division, department of agriculture.

Reports of a shortage, however, are "exaggerated and misleading," he said. The price in-consumers was due to U.S. imports, with prices expected to remain firm until the spring crop hits the market.

PRICES VARY SHARPLY
Retail prices vary sharply across Canada. In Halifax supermarkets, housewives were paying 95 to 99 cents for 10
