A vast amount of cheap fish is annually wasted in England because the people ignorantly suppose it is not fit to eat and won't buy it. One of the useful features of the coming International Fisheries Exhibition at London will be daily demonstrations by the School of Cookery that these so-called inferior sorts of fish are savory and nutritious.

Many people are slow to take steps for the improvement of cattle because of the time required to bring about noticeable results. An improved kind of grain or seed can be planted in the ground, and a few months they are required to demonstrate its work. Many months, however, are necessary for the farmer to reap the benefits of the introduction of good breeding cattle on the premises.

Portuguese deputies have to swear on the Holy Gospels to be faithful to the King and to maintain the Catholic Apostolic and Roman religion. A Republican deputy during the present session has introduced a bill to abolish the religious oath. He would replace the Holy Gospels by an urn filled with the electoral returns, and proposes that every deputy shall stretch his hand over the urn, which would represent the national sovereignty, and promise on his honor to devote all his powers to the preparation of just and wise laws, which would tend to establish on solid bases the rights of the citizen and the greatness and glory of the country.

Marshal Bazaine's book is entitled "Episodes of the war of 1870, and the Siege of Metz." It is dedicated to ex-Queen Isabella of Spain. Among the documents in the work are Bazaine's autograph report to the Emperor Napoleon, while the latter was at Wilhelmshohe, and the letter from the Marshal to the Empress Eugenie—September 14, 1870—advising her to take horse and assume the command of the Metz division. The Marshal considers the defensive qualities of Alsace-Lorraine were not utilized to the fullest extent. He asserts the disorganization of the War Department at the beginning of the war rendered it impossible to obtain useful information or instruction from headquarters. He declares he never saw a mitrailleuse until that weapon was brought into Metz.

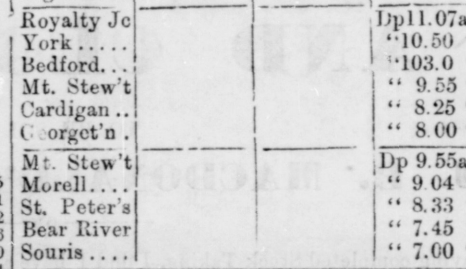
