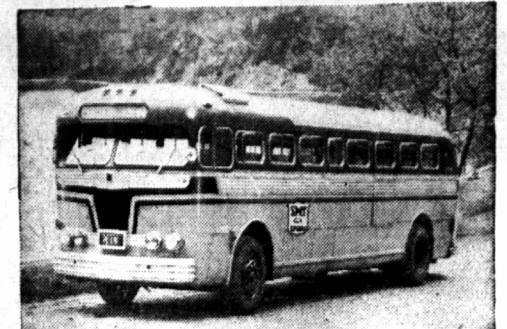

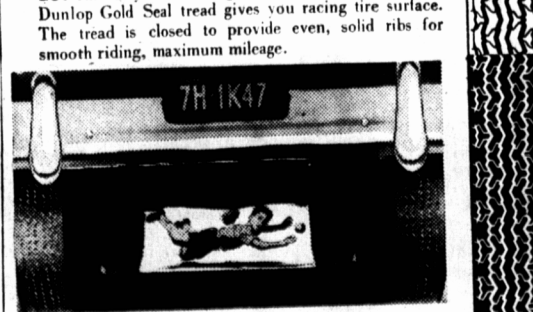

In three papers delivered before the congress, now meeting in Toronto, the four United States doctors said their studies indicated a definite personality pattern among arthritics. The papers were among 225 from many parts of the world to be heard by the more than 1,000 delegates to the week-long congress.

Canadian Plane Disasters Listed

- Sunday's crash of a Pacific Western Airlines plane in British Columbia and the death of all 14 persons aboard was the second major air disaster in Canada this year. Eight were killed in March near Manotick, Ont.
- Canada's worst toll was in the crash of a Trans-Canada Air Lines North Star in British Columbia Dec. 9 of last year in which 62 persons died.
- Major Canadian plane disasters include:
 - Feb. 6, 1941—12 killed, TCA, Armstrong, Ont.
 - Oct. 30, 1941—20, American Airlines, near St. Thomas, Ont.
 - Oct. 26, 1942—16, BAF ferry command bomber, Dorval, Que.
 - Dec. 20, 1945—13, Canadian Pacific Airlines, Vancouver.
 - Oct. 19, 1943—24, RCAF Liberator, near St. Donat, Que.
 - April 25, 1944—16, RAF transport, near Montreal.
 - Oct. 4, 1944—11, Bomber crash off Vancouver Island.
 - July 13, 1945—14, RCAF Liberator, on Vancouver Island.
 - Sept. 15, 1946—21, RCAF transport, near Estevan, Sask.
 - April 29, 1947—15, TCA near Vancouver.
 - July 24, 1948—29, Rimouski Airline, Gaspé Peninsula.
 - Aug. 21, 1949—20, RCAF, between Churchill, Man., and Winnipeg.
