General Telegraphic News. QUEBEC, Sept. 6.—The provincial board of health wants immigration prohibited until the cholera epidemic in Europe is over.

LONDON, Sept. 6.—The Hamburg correspondent of the News says: The old port of the city is dirty and stifling and its population of 150,000 is squeezed into space of an English town of 5,000 inhabitants.

MONTREAL, Sept. 6.—The Gazette's St. John's, N.H., correspondent says that none of the daily newspapers have yet been re-established, so that the usual source of intelligence of the fisheries is wanted.

MONTREAL, Sept. 6.—Julien Brousseau, a well-known customs officer, stationed at the Canadian Pacific depot, has defaulted and gone to the States, leaving a shortage of \$2,000 in his accounts with the customs.

LONDON, Sept. 6.—The epidemic of scarlet fever in this city is daily growing in severity. The number of cases is steadily increasing, and the hospital accommodation of the city is exhausted.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—Surgeon General Wyman of the marine hospital service last night received the following despatch from J. Lowe, Canadian Deputy Minister of Agriculture: "The high commissioner for Canada in London has been notified to warn all steamship companies by circular and through the press not to embark emigrants for the United States via Canada, as in such case the vessel and immigrants would be detained the same period as the United States quarantine."

The Montreal Gazette takes just pride in calling attention to the very satisfactory position, relative to other American cities that Montreal occupies in regard to trade.

Next as to foreign commerce the figures are: New York: \$959,400,000. Boston: 158,800,000. Philadelphia: 118,500,000. Baltimore: 112,200,000. New Orleans: 150,100,000. Montreal: 92,584,000. San Francisco: 87,800,000.

When it is remembered, remarks the Gazette, "that Montreal is a closed port for five months in the year, it can fairly be claimed that she ranks next to New York, of all the cities on the continent, in respect of the value of foreign commerce."

These figures show a most gratifying progression, the aggregate foreign commerce of Montreal having mounted up in value from \$85,290,910 to \$92,584,547 in the last four years, and increase of 35 per cent.
