

**POLICE COURT.**

Nov. 14—John King, drunk and disorderly, convicted 14s. 6d. 24s. 6d. costs or to be imprisoned 48 hours.  
 15—Andrew Doyle, for assault on Charles Thomas Welsh, and Charles Thomas Welsh and James Dewar for assault on Michael Campion—cases entered into bill, but owing to these cases being completed with there, none of the parties were brought to the Court, judgments were deferred till a future day.  
 16—Susan Carpenter for assault on Ann MacDonnell convicted, fined 10s. with costs or to be imprisoned 14 days—committed.  
 17—Catherine Butler, for assault on Mary Peters, convicted, fined 10s. with 12 1/2 shillings or committed for 10 days.  
 Mary Ann Slattery for assault on Mary Peters, convicted, fined 5s. with 12s. 9d. or committed for 5 days.  
 Michael Skene, Indian, for desertion of the Lord's day—on view of his Worship the Mayor—fined 10s. or to be imprisoned 5 days—committed for 10 days.  
 Thomas Powers for assault on Andrew Watson, parties settled out of Court.
