TORONTO, Nov. 15.—Moderate west to southwest winds. Friday: Probably becoming unsettled, south and southeast winds.

—The Quebec Legislature has been dissolved. December 7 will be polling day.

—On the 24th of October last, past, Dr McIntosh, of Murray River, was brutally assaulted and battered on his own premises with sticks used by a neighbor's son and daughter, and the Doctor is still suffering from the injuries sustained—the injuries to the head and body being particularly severe. He is completely laid aside from his professional duties and it may be some time before he is out again. The parties, we understand, are sent up to the Supreme Court to await their trial. It is to be hoped that such conduct will receive the punishment which it merits and be a lesson to evil doers in future. The condition of Dr. McIntosh is so serious that he telegraphed Dr. Macneill, of Charlottetown to visit him professionally.

THE Conservative candidates in Quebec ascribe the defeat of their party to the race cry and heavy expenditures of money. Mr. Bergeron, speaking of the result at a public meeting held in Montreal said that no one should be discouraged, for while the money spent by the Liberal party in the recent election had already passed away, the devotion of the Conservatives is greater than ever. Mr. Bergeron advised moderation in both Ontario and Quebec, and he felt assured that the principles of the Conservative party, the true national party of Canada, would surely prevail.

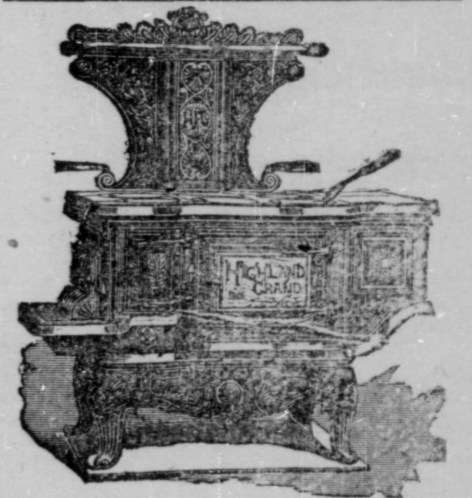
