The death occurred on Friday, July 29, at the Prince County Hospital, of Mrs. Cyril Gaudet (the former Edna DesRoches) of Tignish Shore in her 82nd year.

Mrs. Gaudet's father, Dominic DesRoches of Tignish Shore also survives. The funeral took place on Monday morning August 1st from her late residence to the Roman Catholic Church of St. Simon and St. Jude in Tignish. The Requiem Mass was said by the pastor, Rt. Rev. M.J. Rooney, Rev. Arthur Pendergast of Palmer Road and Seminarian Leo Gillis were in the sanctuary while Rev. F. Tardiff was in the choir and also officiated at the grave.

Industrial Coordination Is Aim

The government's interest in the attraction of new industry to the province as well as the encouragement and expansion of local industry was expressed yesterday morning by Premier Alex Campbell.

His chief effort is being made to co-ordinate a total effort from community groups, the Executive Council in meeting the needs of our province for industrial expansion and development.

The Premier hopes that within one month industrial development commissions in three areas of the province will have been established and that they, in cooperation with provincial and federal agencies will become active and successful in their efforts to locate and encourage industry within the province.

The underlying feature of the program would be to encourage the development and expansion of industry on a non-political basis and that the responsibility of government would be to provide the necessary machinery and technical and expert services of men experienced in this field as well as financial resources required to make the various projects possible, the Premier said.

Souris Liquor Outlet Suspended

The present agreement authorizing the establishment of a new liquor outlet at Souris between the Prince Edward Island Liquor Commission and Reginald Peters of Souris has been suspended until a comprehensive study of the needs of Kings County have been reappraised in view of the demands on existing facilities at Cardigan.

The announcement was made this morning by Premier Alex Campbell who stated no further announcement is expected to be made until the commission has had an opportunity of making a full report to the Executive Council.

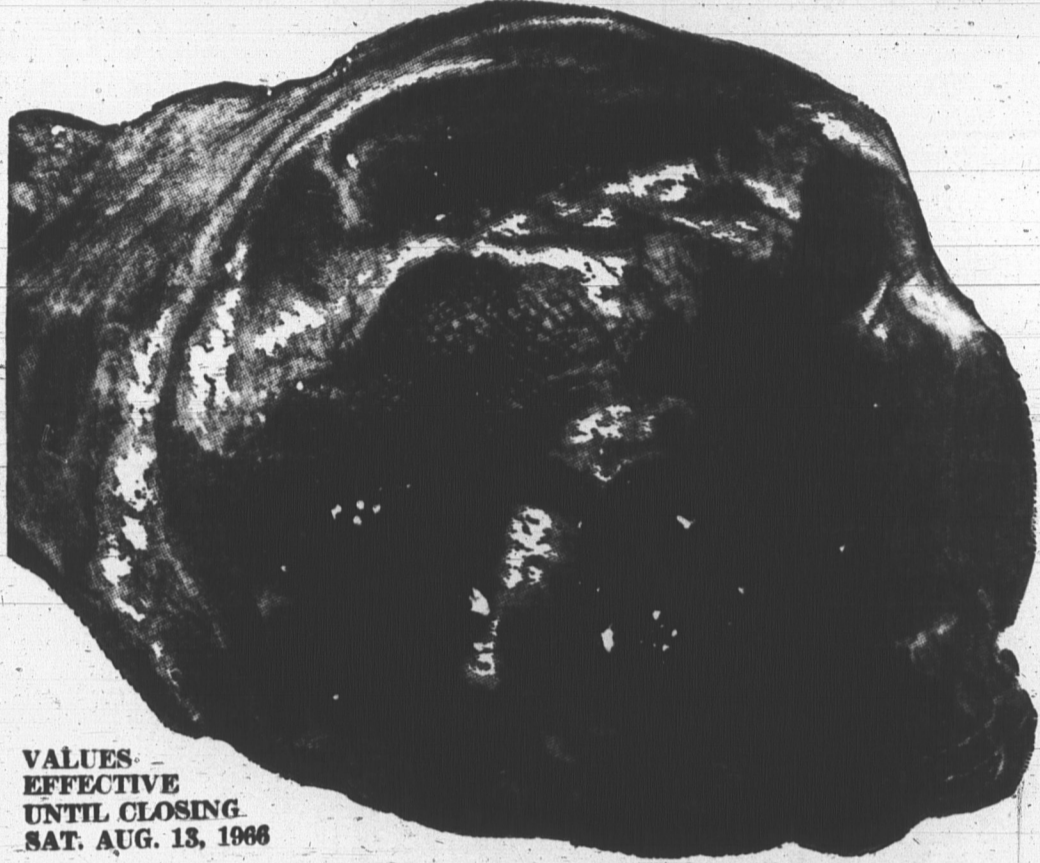

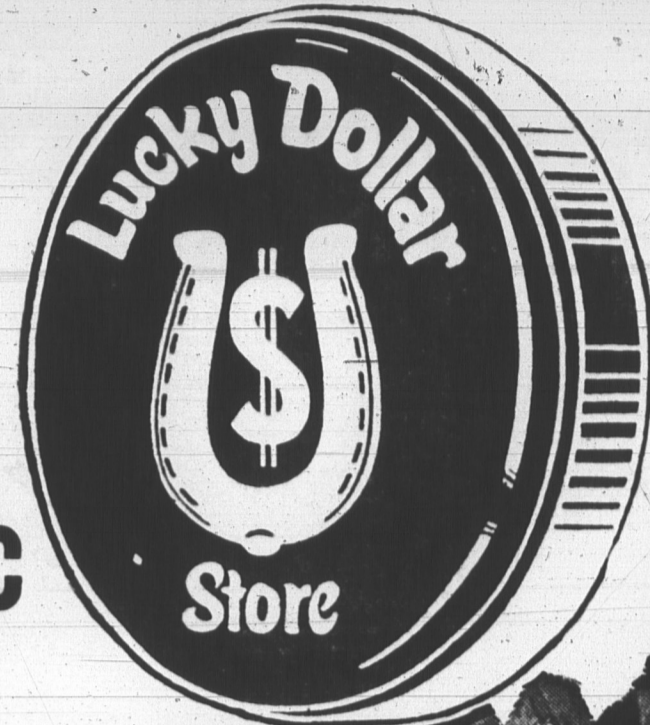
