Dear Sally:

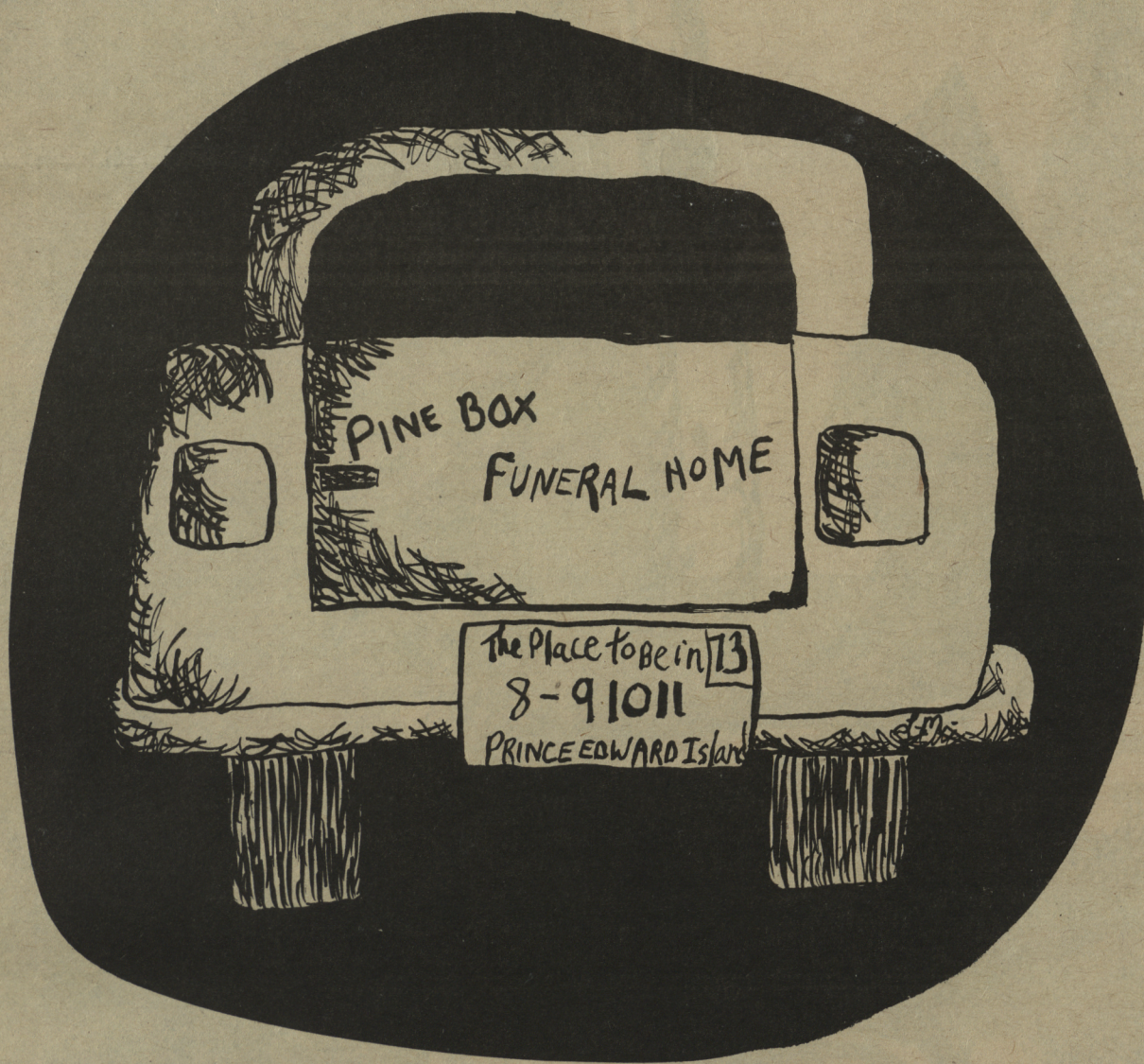

and relate to the conduct of fundamental or applied research in

-the planning, collection, processing, analysis, evaluation and presentation of information, including the development and application of statistical concepts in the design of procedure for these purposes;

-the planning, development and evaluation of projects, programs or policies having economic or sociological consequences;  
 -the writing and editing of papers and reports;  
 -the provision of advice regarding the economic or sociological implications of projects, programs or policies  
 -the supervision or direction of any of the above duties.

Most positions are in Ottawa with a small number of positions in other centres in Canada.

The Economics, Sociology and Statistics Group is classified in five levels with salaries ranging to

Level 1 -	\$14,200
Level 2 -	20,500
Level 3 -	23,300
Level 4 -	25,800
Level 5 -	27,250

Starting salaries depend upon qualifications of applicants and levels of positions. A number of attractive positions are currently vacant at the intermediate and senior levels.
