SUCCESSFUL TREATMENT OF EXCESSIVE PERSPIRATION

One of the difficult and distressing symptoms with which the physician is faced is excessive perspiration, not only of the hands and feet but often of the entire body.

Because there are a considerable number of cases of excessive perspiration not suffering with ulcer and not receiving bantnine treatment, it may be well to report the information regarding use of bantnine, as reported by Drs.
