DISTILLED WATER.
IT IS CHEAPER TO MAKE IT YOUR-
SELF AT YOUR OWN HOME.
Mineral Waters, Too, Can be Manufactured
in the House at Trifling Expense If
You Know How—Means of Preventing
Typhoid Fever and Other Diseases.

Why not buy a private still for your
household? Not a whisky still, but
just a machine to make pure water
for home consumption. You can pur-
chase one for a few dollars, and it
will make all you have to do is to
clean it out once in a couple of weeks.
Just now epidemics of typhoid fever
are frightening people all over the
country. This dread disease seems to
be gaining ground steadily from year
to year. Its sole cause is bad water.
Polluted drink is likewise accountable
for malaria, the germs of which find
their way from the stomach into the
blood, where they feed on the red cor-
puscles. Public recognition of these
facts has brought a rapidly increasing
demand for distilled water, which is
manufactured on a large scale by con-
cerns in the big cities. The price of it
varies from 7 cents to 12 cents a gal-
lon.

That is cheap enough for absolute
insurance against many of the worst
diseases to which human beings are
exposed. But the most inexpensive
plan is the household still. Water from
the city main passes into a reservoir,
in which it can not rise above a cert-
ain limit. It is submitted to a pro-
cess of distillation. At the same time,
the necessary heat being furn-
ished by a single gas jet. The con-
trivance is wholly automatic.
The body of an average man con-
tains 46 quarts, and the contents of water.
He drinks every day 37 ounces and
eats 35 ounces of water. Of course,
foods commonly hold a large per-
centage of water. The bones of this in-
dividual are nearly one-fourth water;
his brain, muscles, lungs and heart
are three-fourths water, and his blood
is more than four-fifths water. Evi-
dently water is of sufficient impor-
tance to the human system to be wor-
thy of serious consideration. The risk
of germ poisoning from this source
is greater than the danger from all
other things taken into the body com-
bined.

It is notoriously a fact that the wa-
ter of each city has its own peculiar
contamination. A stranger not feeling
well is informed that he has not got
the local drink. If he does
not the meanwhile, his body may learn
in time to withstand the attacks of the
germs prevalent in that particular
vicinity. It is found that two-thirds
of the preventable diseases of modern
times arise from the use of impure
water. Hospitals are maintained, cen-
surers are laid out and beautified, and
undertakers are supported by bad
water. Men and women who should be
in the bloom of health are made
invalids, children are cut off at the
dawn of life, and the aged and infirm
are swept away by the potent poison.

The consumption of mineral waters
is increasing at an astonishing rate.
It may be said of nearly all of them
that the various salts which they con-
tain are present in such small quan-
tities as to have no medicinal value.
Mineral waters are used, however, be-
cause they induce people to drink
more water. Most persons do not
drink water. Water is a powerful sol-
vent of impurities, and it is more
efficient in keeping the blood pure than
all the blood purifying medicines com-
bined. Such salts as are put
into mineral waters, and which are
readily absorbed, are common enough.
They are mostly common salt, such as
is used in the kitchen, and the salts of
lime and magnesia. Hungary water
is a natural solution of Epsom salts
in water, and contains the bicarbonate
of lime and magnesia in extremely small
quantities. It is, in fact, nothing more
than a very pure water charged
with carbonic acid gas. The gas is
said to be obtained directly from the
Apollinaris wells, which are situated
in the Rhine Province of Germany.
Ordinary distilled water charged
with carbonic acid gas is just as good
as any of the mineral waters. People
are very apt to find it disagreeable
because of its flatness. This difficulty
may be overcome by adding to each
gallon of it 10 grains of bicarbonate
of soda and 20 grains of citric acid.
This renders it slightly effervescent,
charging it with a little carbonic acid
gas. Ships of war and merchant ves-
sels also nowadays are provided with
apparatus for distilling sea water. The
modern method is that he happens to
be shipwrecked, has no occasion to
complain of "water, water everywhere,
and not a drop to drink." Of course
neither salt nor germs. All natural
waters, however pure, hold more or
less of mineral salts. Sparkling clear-
ness in water is apt to be a bad sign.
Pure water indicates that it contains
no sewage, the latter being a first-
rate precipitant. The sparkle may
be due to the presence of dangerous
organic matter, the decomposition of
which liberates gas. As silt increases
the water becomes polluted, bright to
the eye, poisonous in nature, and
to the taste, so that the appetite of the
habitué is cured. The sparkle of a natural
water is very rarely unaccompanied by su-

It may be imitated readily, nor,
inasmuch as distilled water is em-
ployed for a basis, is it to be supposed
that the compound is less than a third
than the original. The latter is a loss
are commonly produced by the con-
cerns which put up soda water. The
latter business has grown to enor-
mous proportions. Soda water goes
by that name because soda used to be
employed in its manufacture. Now-
adays marble dust is used instead. This
substance is placed in a new, tight con-
tainer to purify it. Finally it is forced
into 10-gallon receptacles containing
water. This is done under great pres-
sure, the receptacles being continually
agitated meanwhile on a sort of cradle
so as to enable the gas to take up
as much of the water as possible. The
10-gallon receptacles are furnished to
apothecaries for use in connection
with fountains, being returned for re-
filling to the soda-water factory as
fast as they are emptied.

How One Should Shake Hands.
Few of those who shake the hands
of public men on occasions of recep-
tions held in their honor realize the ef-
fects of this process if long continued
upon the person who submits to it.
Inquiry of them would often elicit the
fact that there were swollen hands
or strained muscles and badly affected
nerves as its result. President Polk
had an experience of this kind which
led him to study into the art of shaking
hands, for his own protection, and
this is his conclusion with regard to
a strong grip, he could not fall suf-
fer from it; but if he would shake and
not be shaken, grip and not be grip-
ped, taking care always to squeeze
the hand of his adversary as hard as
the adversary squeezed him, he would
suffer no inconvenience from it. I can
generally anticipate a strong grip
from a stronger man, and I then gain
advantage of him, by being gripped
than he, and saving him by the tip
of his fingers. This has the obvious
advantage of demonstrating cordially
on the part of those who thus heartily
grasp hands held out to them.—Boston
Herald.
