VIENNA, May 21 - At a meeting of the Union of Austrian Daily Newspapers, attended by representatives of all organizations connected with the newspaper industry today, the chairman reported that the present crisis is due to the rise in the price of paper since before the war by 1,600 per cent., together with the very high telegraph and telephone charges and the heavy taxation on advertising.

IN MEMORIAM MR. SIDNEY FAY MacNEVIN A sudden gloom was cast over the residents of Bonshaw and vicinity on the morning of April 25th, when it was learned that death had claimed as its victim Mr. Sidney Fay MacNevin at the early age of 26 years.

GENEROUS GIFT - Mr. Peter J. Oliver of this city recently called upon Mr. G. D. Wright, Treasurer of the P. E. Island Orphanage and after paying his contribution of \$25 for the Orphanage, intimated that he would like to furnish the Nursery in memory of his late wife, Mr. Wright made the necessary inquiries and ascertained that the Nursery could be nicely equipped for \$355. This amount Mr. Oliver cheerfully handed over. The gift was a very generous one and is greatly appreciated by the Trustee Board. The Orphanage is now nearing completion and Mr. Oliver's example affords opportunity for liberal disposed philanthropists to do something similar, such as the furnishing of the dormitories, the school room or the assembly room.

MR. HAZARD'S WILL - The will of the late Mr. Horace Hazard has been presented for probate. He leaves an estate worth about \$50,000. The bequests include \$500 to the Prince Edward Island Hospital; \$500 to St. Paul's Church, also sundry amounts ranging from \$5,000 down to \$100 each to various beneficiaries including the children of his brother in New Zealand, relatives and intimate personal friends in this city about a score in all. This residue of the estate which will be in the vicinity of \$30,000 is left to establish a home for the support of aged Protestant ladies in this city. The will was signed about six years ago. The executors of the estate are Judge Hazard, Gilbert Gaudet and E. T. Higgs, M. P. P.

REV. MR. EATON'S IMPRESSIONS - "One of the first impressions one gets of Charlottetown is the number of spires pointing heavenward," said Rev. Ross C. Eaton last night in a preliminary evening sermon at the Baptist Church. "The people of Charlottetown have given expression to their religious instincts in the erection of these places of worship and judging by this outward evidence and also by going around among the people themselves one notices a great contrast compared with the masses on the other side of the line, and especially in Boston. It is always easier to condemn than to congratulate and suppose it would be easy to bring out some scandal even in Charlottetown, but one of my early impressions of this city is the large place that religion holds in the life of the people." At the close of the service last night a special musical recital was very capably given by the choir under Prof. Duncan.

DR. LAVERNE, NOBEL PRIZE WINNER IN 1907, DEAD

PARIS, May 21 - Dr. A. Laverne 77, professor at the Pasteur Institute, famous for his researches in malarial diseases and sleeping sickness, died today. He was awarded the Nobel prize for medicine in 1907.
