In the Diary of the Rev. Samuel Seaburg of the first Protestant Episcopal Church in the new world (Date 1st June, 1768) we read:

"The lottery ticket No. 5866, by the blessing of God, in the Light house and Public Lottery of New York, appointed by law A.D. 1768, drew in my favor 500 pounds... for which I now record to my posterity my thanks and praise to God Almighty, the giver of all good gifts. Amen!"

A unique form of torture known to medieval times was the "ordal of water." The victim was chained to a stone wall and a stream of water the thickness of a thread directed onto his head. The constant drip, drip of the water finally wore a hole through the skull causing the prisoner's death.

The U.S. census in 1870 recorded that John Pyle of New York City named his five children, Imprimis, Pimis, Appendix, Addendum and Estun, and a fellow named Walter Sykes names his four sons Dowell, Dewell, Farewell and Lovewell.

Fredericton, N.B., has the distinction of having been created the first Cathedral City in North America (April 25, 1845). John Medley, Rector.

Queen Victoria's command that the capital of New Brunswick should be a Bishop's See, which raised the town to the dignity of a city.

In 1880 the Louisiana Gazette published this ad: "Wanted by young man a wife without going to the trouble of making a fortune for her to spend. I offer myself as the prize in a lottery to all widows and virgins under 32; the number of the tickets to be 600 at \$50 each. Only one number to be drawn, the drawer of which will get plus the \$30,000." Missionaries did not reach Russia until about the year 960 and the steppes east of Stalingrad were not occupied till 1750, or about the same time as the American movement into the prairies.

Switzerland is of world-wide interest due to its representing in its diversity a little world of its own. It has two different religions, four commonly spoken (and official) languages, widely varied environments, a high level of education, a sense of the futility of war, and a feeling that the brotherhood of man is well worth contending for. What little Switzerland has accomplished the rest of Europe might well emulate.

A recent survey across Canada to determine the food habits of five per cent eat neither fish nor meat, 20 per cent put cheese on their list of taboos, and 48 per cent do not eat eggs or fruits.

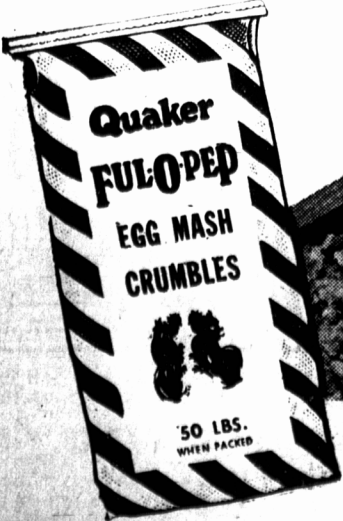
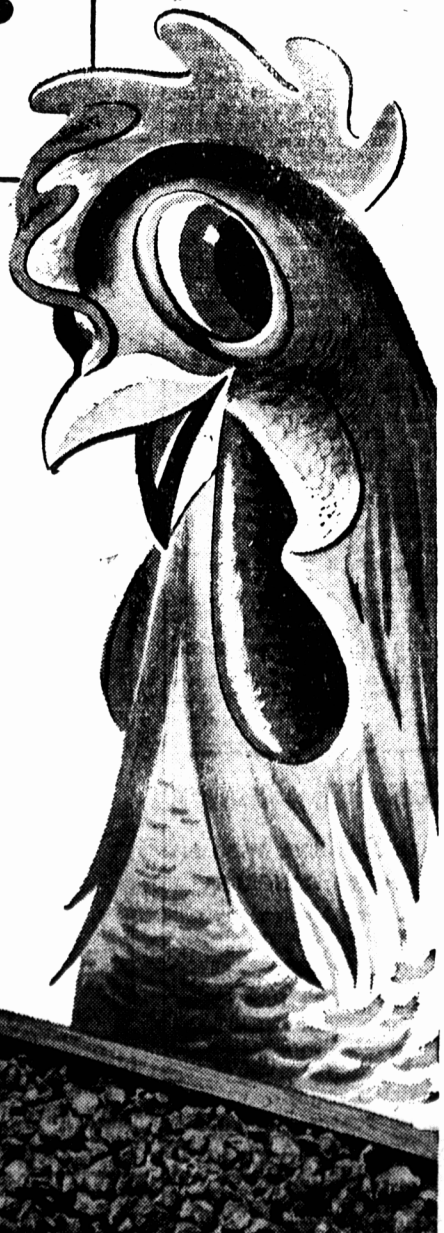

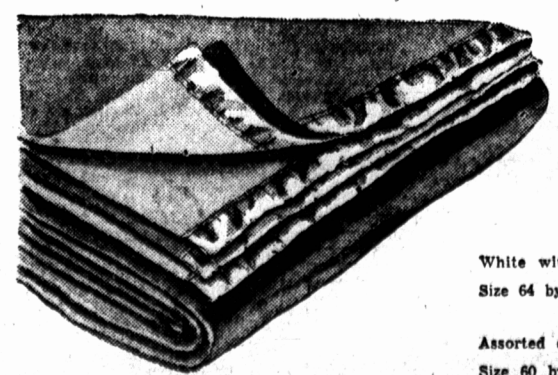
