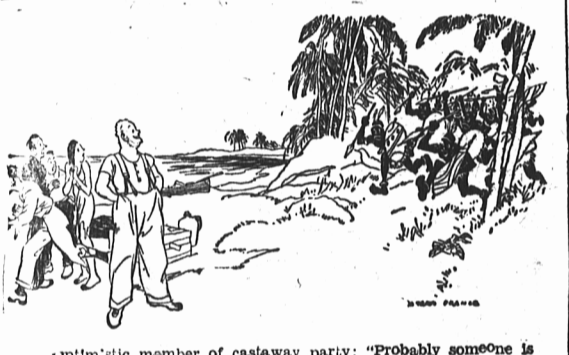

Livestock

MONTREAL, July 25 (CP)—Receipts on the Montreal livestock market today were 748 cattle, 393 sheep and lambs, 1,105 hogs and 715 calves, including close to 400 cattle held over from Monday's market.
Cattle were at a standstill. Calves and lambs were barely steady. Hogs remained unchanged.
A large percentage of the cattle held over were medium quality steers. There were no early sales today. Yesterday's market closed with prices fully 50 cents lower.
Veal calves ranged from 45 for common light kinds to 47 for medium good kinds. Good veals made \$7.25 to \$7.50 with an odd top up to \$8. Grassers were mostly \$4.
Good ewes and wethers brought \$9.10, bucks \$8.10 and culls \$7.10. Sheep were from 2.10 to \$4. Hogs were 39.75 for hams fed and watered and 210 off trucks. Selects drew 31 per hog premium with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows were \$5.25 to \$6.25. Hogs sold on Grade A brought \$13.35 cold weight.

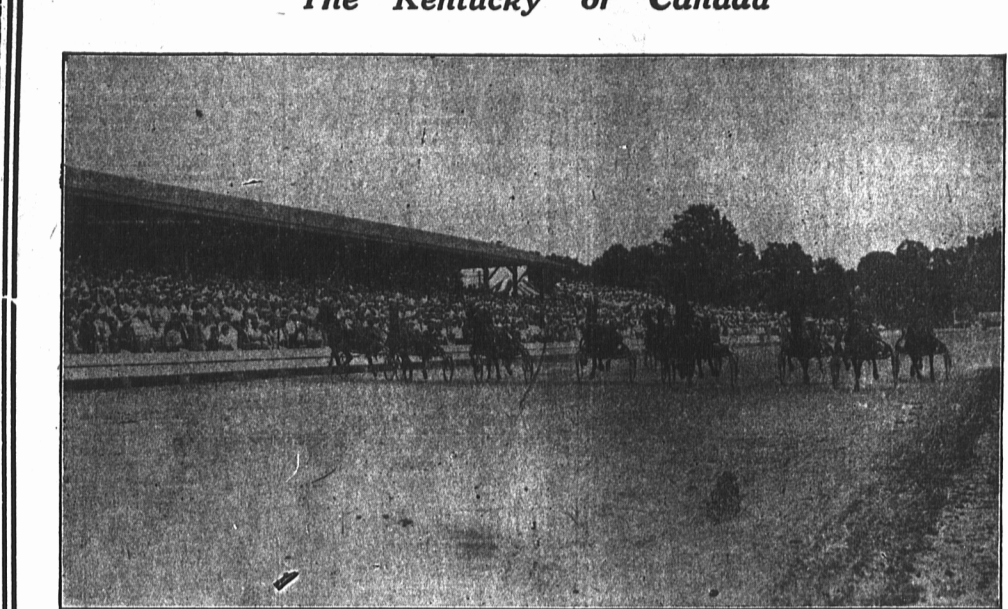
Produce Prices

MONTREAL, July 25 (CP)—Prices were mixed in the Canadian commodity exchange today as butter weakened 1 1/2 to 1-4 of a cent while cheese firmed 1-16 to 1-8 and eggs were unchanged.
Butter spot: Que. (92 score) 21 1-4.
Cheese spot: Quebec white 10 13-16; 16-7-8; Quebec colored 10 13-16.
Salts: 400 Quebec white 10 3-4; 700 Quebec white 10 13-16; 150 Quebec colored 10 13-16.
Eggs spot: A-large 27b; A-medium 25b; B-large 18b; C 15b.
MONTREAL, July 25 (CP)—Egg prices remained unchanged on open produce markets here today, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized butter eased slightly while Quebec white and colored cheese moved up about 1-8 of a cent. P. E. I. potatoes held steady, N. B. and Maine slipped five cents and Quebec new crop added a similar amount.
Creamery butter prinst to retailers sold for 22 1-2-23 cents a pound and solids for 22-22 1-2. Western butter delivered in Montreal was unquoted. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized in wholesale jobbing lots made 21 3-8-1-2.
Ontario white and colored cheese were both quoted at 11 5-8. Quebec white was quoted at 10 7-8 and colored at 11.
Graded egg shipments in used free cases were offered at 27-27 1-2 cents a dozen for A large, 25 1-2 for A-medium, 17 1-2-18 1-2 for B-large, 15 for C.
Potatoes: N. B. and Maine No. 1 75's mts 1 25-1.35; E. I. No. 1 mts 75's 1 25-1.35; Quebec new crop No. 1 75's 90-1.00; Quebec new crop No. 2 75's 80-85.

The Provincial Exhibition Association will give \$500 to be distributed among the winners along with the amount paid in for these Futurities.
SPECIAL PRIZES FOR DRIVERS AND OWNERS
A special ribbon will be given to the owner of the winning horse in each race. THE MACDONALD TOBACCO COMPANY OF MONTREAL has donated a beautiful Trophy, known as The British Consols Trophy, which will be awarded to the Driver scoring the most points during the meeting. This Association will also give \$20 to the driver scoring the most points during the meeting. \$10 to the driver scoring the second most points during the meet. First place counts five points, second place three points, third place two points and fourth place one point. \$10 will be given the winning driver in each race.
\$10 will be given the driver driving the fastest heat trotted during the meet and \$10 to the driver driving the fastest heat paced during the meet.
Ten Dollars will be given the caretaker of the horse trotting the fastest heat and Ten Dollars to the caretaker of the horse pacing the fastest heat.
Five Dollars will be given to the caretaker of each horse winning a race in the trotting and pacing classes during the meet.
Fifty Dollars will be given to the owner of the horse that beats track pacing record of 2:05 1-2 except as provided for below. Fifty Dollars to the owner of the horse that beats the track trotting record of 2:08 3-4 except as provided for below. In case two horses beat the above records then the awards go to the fastest horse. If two horses tie for the awards the money will be divided equally.

GENERAL CONDITIONS
(ALL RACES MILE HEATS)
The Charlottetown Race Track is now one of the fastest, best laid out and cared for tracks, and surely the most beautifully situated of any in the Maritime Provinces. A great deal of effort will be made to keep it in apple pie order, all through the period before the races and during the races so that no horse will become unsound or suffer injury and to enable them to make fast time.
Horsemen (providing they are racing exclusively at our meeting) by wiring at our expense notifying us of their arrival will be met at the train and their baggage transferred to the grounds without cost to them, also taken away without cost to them. Every effort will be made to make the horseman's stay pleasant and send them away feeling that they have been well treated.
All races to be raced on three heat plan: 10% of each purse will be awarded to the winner. The remainder will be divided into three equal parts, one part to be raced for each heat. In the event of there being three heat winners they shall have a fourth heat to determine the winner.
All purses divided 50, 25, 15 and 10. Entry fee 5% Five per cent of the money raced for each heat will be deducted from the first and second horses; 3% will be deducted from the third horse and 2% from the fourth horse. Entrance fees and deductions do not apply to Futurities.
Six horses to enter and four to start.
Right reserved to change program, reject any entry, or if entry appears to lay over field to the extent that there is not, in the opinion of the management, sufficient competition, then the said entry may be transferred to a faster class or entry fee refunded, bar any driver and to declare race off on account of bad weather, or failing to obtain satisfactory number of entries or starters to trans-

fer horses to another class to which they are eligible, re-open or substitute another without advertising, or alter or extend racing dates.
Additional entries of an individual ownership may be made in any class by the payment of 1% on closing date, but entries of separate ownership, although in the same stable must pay installment in full.
Two entries of the same ownership may start in the same race, providing the full 5% is paid on each starter, the drivers having the approval of the Judges.
All horses with names of drivers must be declared in 11 o'clock a. m. the day prior to the race, when positions will be drawn to enable us to print score cards with actual starters.
Eligibility based on U. S. T. A. money winning classification.
The Exhibition Association assumes no responsibility for any accident or damage to any person or property during this meeting, and this understanding is part of this contract.
Hay, Straw and Stabling Free.
U. S. T. A. rules to govern, except where they conflict with these conditions. Be sure and bring your eligibility certificates and driver's license.
THE OFFICIALS
The officials will be selected for their experience and reliability and will be instructed to carry out the rules fairly and fairly. All purse money will be paid immediately after the races and horsemen are asked to get same from Secretary before leaving.
PRESENTATION OF PRIZE MONEY
Friday evening the President will award special ribbons, prizes, to the winning owners, drivers and caretakers.
