The British Elections.

The Home Rule confederation of Great Britain on the 12th inst., issued the following violent manifesto to Home Rule Associations, and the Irish people of Great Britain:—

Lord Beaconsfield has issued, in the disguise of a letter to the Viceroy of Ireland, a declaration of war upon your country and your friends. The Ministry is seeking to obtain renewed terms of office by sowing dissension and hatred between Englishmen and Irishmen; and Beaconsfield's vicious manifesto directly appeals to your worst passions and prejudices for the purpose of stirring up Englishmen against the Irish nationality. The Ministry neither knows nor cares how to relieve your truly distressed fellow countrymen. Beaconsfield's foreign policy has been an inglorious, disastrous failure. Vote against him as you would against an enemy of your country."

Bacon: A dull market at about previous prices. Hams continue inactive. Lard very quiet. Finest American cheese, 70s. to 74s.

CATTLE.
Liverpool Market, 25th ult.—The supply of cattle was rather larger than on Monday last, and included a cargo of Canadians. Of sheep the supply was smaller. The demand was slow for both cattle and sheep at the full prices of last Monday for each. The American supply of live cattle and fresh meat was considerably less than last week, viz.: 400 cattle and 1,000 carcasses of mutton. Beef 6 1/2d. to 8 1/2d.; mutton, 9 1/2d. At market 1,385 cattle and 4,992 sheep.

THE Government Post states that Bismarck has ordered the collection of diplomatic documents attesting to the hostile intention of Russia towards Germany, including papers bearing upon Gortchakoff's propositions to France for an anti-German alliance.

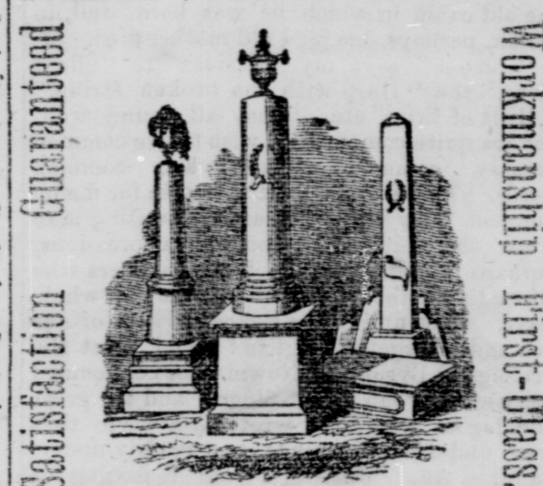
