NEW OREGON RAISINS.—It is stated that Mr. Stiles of Springfield, New Jersey, a paper manufacturer, recently received from Oregon a quantity of raisins, from which he caught a fever, and died to be the yellow fever, and died in two days.

DEDICATION OF SYNAGOGUE.—A new Hebrew Synagogue was dedicated at Cincinnati, on the 14th inst., by the Rev. Dr. Raphael, of New York. The sum of \$25,000 has been raised by subscription to pay for the building, which is said to be the largest in the world.

ANNOUINCING WITH OIL.—Professor Simpson, of Edinburgh, has been the means of bringing to light a curious corroborative of the sanitary value of oil. It appears that the learned professor, who was engaged in the manufacturing town of Galashiels, was casually informed that the workers in the wool mill in that place were exempt from the attacks of consumption and scrofula. On inquiring of the medical men in the vicinity, the truth of the statement was confirmed, and he immediately deemed expedient to pursue investigations on a border scale. Communications were accordingly sent to physicians, residing in Dunfermline, Alloa, Thillicoultry, Inverness, and other districts, where wool is a staple occupation; and in the case of each it was ascertained that similar immunity was enjoyed from the fatal diseases mentioned. It further appeared that in some of the localities scrofularia had been added to the list; and also, that employment in the mills not only preserved the health, but the children of delicate constitutions were sent to the wool works to obtain the express purpose of acquiring strength, a result in almost every instance attained.
