THE OPPOSITION MEETING.

THE attention of all electors is directed to the advertisement of the meeting to be held in the Lyceum on Wednesday evening. Provincial questions will then be discussed by Provincial speakers of ability, and a clear view of the Provincial situation will be afforded. The meeting will be for business of the highest importance to the city and the province. There will be no special attractions—no ministers from Ottawa—who would be better employed in attending to their own official duties—to line the people on to the loss of their provincial independence. The provincial situation and how to prevent impending financial trouble—these will be the topics discussed at the Opposition meeting to be held tomorrow evening.

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

SOME people are now counting the days remaining to the Nineteenth Century.

It is remarked that the Boers seem to have acquired a new lease of life since the Canadians left South Africa.

A new line of ship—the Virginia Line—has been established to ply between Newport News and London and Liverpool.

THE PATRIOT has no case for the present government. It is still recasting falsified history—old chestnuts—concerning the Government of Auld Lang Syne.

THE London Daily Mail favors a tax of five or ten per cent. on foreign manufactures imported into Canada, the revenue to be denoted to the War fund.

We note that the Guardian has published the Premier's manifesto, but we have not its publication of the manifesto of the Leader of the Opposition. Fair play, Mr Guardian.

MR. TARTE and Sir Wilfrid are just now "running" the Province of Quebec. It will be interesting to note whether or not Prince Edward Island, also will be "run" from Ottawa.

THE Imperial penny postage rate has been applied to the Orange River and Transvaal colonies. While Kruger is being snubbed by Germany and Austria, the British Imperial machine continues in operation.

THE JOURNAL reports that "under Mayor Payment Ottawa has reached a choice between bankruptcy, higher taxation or stoppage of business." Just like P. E. Island under the Farquharson Government!

to accustom the people of Prince Edward Island to the loss of their Provincial independence. He is, at all events, coming to personally exert the power and influence of the Federal government in the Provincial elections.

THE public would be glad to hear that Sir Louis Davies has secured a steamship to leave this port, produce laden, direct for Liverpool. News of this kind would be more acceptable than the Patriot's report that Sir Louis is coming from Ottawa to take part in the Provincial election campaign.

THE Halifax Chronicle exhibits a crowing cock over the announcement that the provincial government of Quebec has carried thirty seats by acclamation; and the St. John Sun remarks that "this exultation is abundantly justified. Mr. Tarte, Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Premier Parent and Mr. Pacaud are carrying all before them in Quebec."

THE Local Government debt is now about one million dollars. The taxpayers of Charlottetown and Royalty are liable for a large proportion of this debt. Come to the Lyceum tomorrow night and show your disapproval of this waste of public money and reckless management.

A REPORT was current this forenoon to the effect that the Deputy Returning Officer at Murray Harbor North had confessed that he had marked the ballot papers and afterwards erased the figures. Upon hearing this a wag remarked that anyone who would be fool enough to make such a blunder would be fool enough to tell it.

AUSTRALIA is now thinking about having a navy. The Brisbane Courier says: "Perhaps when federation is actually in force we may see an Australian fleet 'in being,' officered and manned by natives. Such an evolution would immensely help to encourage that feeling of proper independence which federation will initiate, for nations, like individuals, that rely upon themselves are the successes of history."

THE fruit show at the last annual meeting of the Nova Scotia Fruit Growers' Association having proved a great success, and also a very attractive feature of the session, it is desired to have a similar exhibit at the coming meeting at Wolfville, Jan. 28th, 29th, 30th, 1901. As on the previous occasion, no money prizes will be given, but handsome cards or diplomas, filled out with the recipient's name and for what granted. In addition a number of new and valuable books on horticultural subjects will be awarded.

OF Mr. Foster and Mr. Bergeron, the Montreal Witness, which did all it could to defeat them, now says that their exclusion from Parliament would be a distinct loss to the country. They are not only representative men in the fullest sense of the term, but also Parliamentarians of training and skill, who bring to the discussion of public affairs intellectual familiarity with the complex interests likely to be affected by legislation. The country can ill-afford to dispense with their service simply because one constituency happens to reject them. The interests of the party in securing seats in Parliament for its leaders are important, no doubt, but the interests of the country at large are much greater.

—The ease with which an auto-car may be stered is illustrated by the increasing number of ladies who have taken to the "wheel," or tiller, as the case may be. Of the recent converts the most distinguished is the German Empress, who now pilots her own car through the streets of Berlin. This fact has the more significance inasmuch as the Empress has never been regard-

ed as of a particularly "forward" disposition, and presumably the Emperor's own enthusiasm for motoring has led to an echoing affection for new means of locomotion on the part of his consort. With so influential an example before them more ladies may feel encouraged to essay the management of a car. Already in Paris there are many handsome automobiles steered by "elegantes" with admirable skill, and the time will come when Hyde Park will emulate in this respect the Bois de Boulogne.

A London correspondent remarks "How truly pathetic was the meeting of the Queen and her Canadian soldiers seems to have escaped the English papers. Sitting in a carriage the Queen watched intently the men as they marched by within a few feet of her, and she commenced her speech in grave tones. It was only a few words. But, before it was finished, tears rolled down her majesty's face and her voice broke, and at the end it was almost a sob. It is not astonishing, therefore, that when Col. Otter replied it was in trembling tones, and not one of the men whom he had led into nearly fifty engagements felt ashamed of the grizzled colonel because he cheek was wet with tears."
