He received his BD at Spring Convocation at Pine Hill, writing his thesis on "The Doctrine of the Word of God in the Theology of Karl Barth".

## 4 Liquor Selling Charges Are Laid

Four Charlottetown residents were remanded to June 1 with bail set at \$300 each when they appeared yesterday before Magistrate A. J. Haslam, QC, in city police court on charges of illegally selling liquor.

The accused Wendell Eiby, Ford, Ralph Ernest Chandler, Vernon Frederick Lord and Louis James Doyle, were represented by Gordon Tweedy. Their cars have reportedly been seized.

Earl Cronin of Summersville, charged with operating an automobile without the owner's consent, was remanded to June 3 with bail set at \$300. The automobile was the property of F.R. MacLaine Ltd. The previous charge of theft of an article valued at more than \$50 was withdrawn. Gordon Tweedy represented the accused and Alan Scales acted for the Crown.

For failing to stop at a stop sign Redvers Stewart of New Witshire was fined \$5 and costs for two days.

Two accused were charged with being drunk and incapable. One was fined \$30 and costs for 30 days and the other was fined \$30 and costs for five days.

One accused was fined \$25 and costs or 15 days on a charge of disorderly conduct.

A fine of \$30 and costs or 30 days was imposed on one accused for illegal possession of liquor.

One accused was given 30 days in jail on a charge of vagrancy.

### CFM Session Will Examine Confraternity

An examination of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine program in the Diocese of Charlottetown will highlight the annual spring meeting of the Christian Family Movement, to be held tomorrow afternoon at St. Dunstan's University.

The CCD subject will be introduced by Rev. Dr. Thomas MacLellan, who is responsible for direction of the program in the diocese. Discussion will be provided by a panel made up of CFM couples from Holy Redeemer Parish, and CFMs from a number of representative parishes will report on the situation as it exists in their own areas.

The meeting will also hear reports from CFM groups throughout the diocese, on activities that have taken place during the past year; an outline of the program for 1965-66 will be given by Mr. and Mrs. Cletus Murphy, area representatives; and the session will conclude with celebration of Mass at 5 o'clock at Marian College.
