WINNIPEG, Nov. 23—(CP)—Coarse grains futures prices turned lower on Winnipeg Grain Exchange today. Traders said the United States Thanksgiving holiday and peace rumors in the Korean war were responsible for the drops.

Trading was dull throughout. Selling expanded during the session and commercial demand was relatively thin.

Some domestic shippers were buying oats and barley and processors picked up flax as the price declined. American interest was limited because of the holiday, but some rye selling was said to be for American houses.

Class two and I.W.A. wheat prices were up one-quarter cent across the board.
