Cobalt Therapy Unit Predicted For Halifax Soon

OTTAWA (CP)—Health Minister Martin indicated Wednesday that Halifax soon may have a cobalt 60 beam therapy unit for the treatment of cancer.

He made the statement at the official opening here of a cobalt 60 treatment centre at the Ottawa Civic hospital.

Mr. Martin said the installation of the Ottawa unit brings to 13 the number of Canadian cities now providing this type of treatment. The other cities are Vancouver, Edmonton, Saskatoon, St. Boniface, Winnipeg, Port Arthur, Windsor, London, Hamilton, Toronto, Kingston and Montreal.

He said he recently approved a federal grant to help finance a unit in Saint John, N.B., adding "I understand that consideration is being given to the setting up of a cobalt 60 treatment centre in the Halifax area."

Gets 3-Year Term On False Pretense Charge

SYDNEY—A 40 year-old former Ontario resident who lists his occupation as a "Newspaperman" Monday was sentenced to three years in Dorchester Penitentiary when he appeared before Provincial Magistrate John F. MacDonald on charges of false pretences with intent to defraud.

James P. Carleton, who gave no specific address, pleaded guilty to a total of 10 charges of obtaining money and merchandise under false pretences. Informations against the accused were filed by police in Montreal, Halifax, Amherst, Dartmouth and Sydney.

He was sentenced to three years for obtaining a \$79 typewriter and \$3.00 cash from Merritt Business Machines of Sydney with a worthless cheque.

On eight other charges he received sentences of three months each and on a ninth he was sentenced to six months. All sentences will run concurrently.

Carleton was arrested by RCMP in North Sydney six weeks ago. The accused is also on the wanted list of the Charlottetown Police Department, who are holding a warrant for his arrest for the passing of bogus cheques in this area during the early part of March. Whilst in this district he is said to have posed under the name of William T. giving his occupation that of free-lance photographer.

Medical Checkup For Eisenhower

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower made known Wednesday he is about to undergo a "head-to-toe" physical examination. The regular yearly checkup, which will put the president in Walter Reed Hospital here from tonight until Saturday noon, should show just what shape he is in for the possible rigors of his re-election campaign.

Eisenhower's impending medical examination was disclosed at a press conference when a reporter asked whether he planned a "major checkup" before the Republican national convention.

Yes, right away, said the president—a checkup "from head to toe". He added this had no particular relation to the heart attack he suffered last September although, he said, it naturally would include heart tests.

Later, the White House said this was an informal three-day visit as guest of Sir Roger Makins, British ambassador to the United States. He is to return to London by air June 5.

Sees Hope For Settlement In Middle East

WASHINGTON (AP)—State Secretary Dulles said Tuesday night Russia appears increasingly aware of the dangers of "reckless action" in the Middle East, and there are "grounds for hope" that a settlement may be reached.

Dulles' speech was prepared for a B'nai B'rith international convention in Washington.

Dulles said the NATO allies at the Paris meeting last week expressed "grave concern that the Soviet Union had sought to further its ends by placing fast and loose with peace" in the Middle East.

He said the NATO allies want to avoid "a situation where great military powers confronted each other, by proxy, under conditions which would engage their respective prestiges in a manner ominous for peace."

Earl Of Home Leaves U.K. For Canadian Tour

LONDON (CP)—The secretary of state for Commonwealth relations, the Earl of Home, left by plane Wednesday night for his first visit to Canada. He is accompanied by Lady Home and his private secretary, Harold Smedley.

Lord Home was scheduled to arrive at Gander, Nfld., early today to begin a three-week tour of eastern Canada. Early next year he plans to visit western Canada.

On this trip he will go to Halifax, Charlottetown, Fredericton, Quebec City, Montreal, Toronto and Ottawa.

In Ottawa Lord Home will meet Governor-General Massey, Prime Minister St. Laurent and cabinet ministers.

He also will fly to Washington for an informal three-day visit as guest of Sir Roger Makins, British ambassador to the United States. He is to return to London by air June 5.
