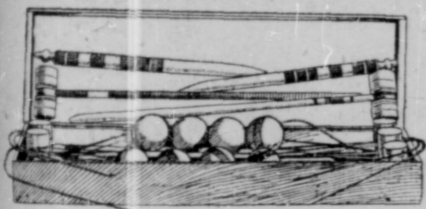

DREYFUS WILL RETURN TO FRANCE

A Cruiser Sent to Bring Him Back

HIS MILITARY RANK AND TITLE HAS BEEN RESTORED.

He is Expected to Arrive at Brest on June 26th.

PARIS, June 5.—The Cabinet Council has decided that the French second class cruiser *Sfax*, now at Fort de France, Martinique, should proceed immediately and bring Dreyfus to France.

The cruiser is expected to arrive at Brest about June 26th, when Dreyfus will be handed to the military authorities, and lodged in the military prison at Rennes, his conviction having been annulled by the united chambers of the Court of Cassation. His military rank and title will be restored to him.

He will occupy an officer's cabin on board the *Sfax* and will be allowed on deck from 1 to 4 every afternoon.

GRAND TRUNK STRIKE OVER.

Men Have Agreed to Submit to Arbitration.

MONTREAL, June 5.—The strike of 1,800 Grand Trunk trackmen for higher wages is over, the workmen having given over their case unreservedly to three Conservative members of Parliament, Taylor, Powell and Clarke, who offered their services as mediators or arbitrators.

The men go back under former circumstances as to pay, etc., taking over their respective sections this morning.

It is expected that an advance in the pay of the men will be secured.

MOB RULE IN PARIS.

A Demonstration Against President Loubet,

WHO HAS TO BE DEFENDED BY THE POLICE,

Many of Whom Were Injured During the Melee.

PARIS, June 5.—President Loubet, accompanied by the Premier and others, drove to the Antiel races yesterday afternoon. As they drove along the Avenue de Champs Elysees the crowd bowed respectfully but on arrival at Antiel they were met by a violent demonstration evidently organized and directed against the President.

There was a storm of hoots, yells and cries of *Panama a bas Loubet* and *vive Lamie*.

A strong force of police kept order and arrested many of the disturbers, including a man who tried to force his way to the president's carriage.

During the second race clamor increased to violence and was plainly directed by a commission of League Patriots collected with supporters both before and behind the Presidential stand, around which a formidable affray proceeded during the grand steeplechase.

Many persons were struck and several policemen were injured in their endeavors to prevent an invasion of the presidential stand.

At the crisis of excitement, while shouts of *vive Lamie*, and *vive De Roulede* were heard on all sides,—Count Christian rushed towards the President brandishing a stick and directed a blow against him, striking his hat.

The crowd rushed upon Christian who only escaped rough handling by being under police protection.

President Loubet remained all the while quite unmoved talking to the premier while the officers of his military household were defending him against violence. Finally after thirty arrests had been made the prefect of police ordered the republican guards to surround the presidential stand.

Police Inspector Grilliere had his head seriously wounded in the melee, and President Loubet has since decorated him with the Cross of the Legion of Honor in recognition of his devotion to duty.

A SENSATION IN OTTAWA

Caused by Absconding Bank Official

HENDERSON, THE ACCOUNTANT OF THE UNION BANK.

Disappears with Funds to the Amount of \$200,000.

OTTAWA, June 5.—The sensation of the hour is the departure of Accountant Henderson, of the Union Bank, and his appropriation of funds of the bank.

The loss is supposed to be \$200,000, but as the transactions are intricate and ingenious, involving false entries in the books and various bogus transfers of money between the customers of the bank, it is impossible to ascertain the exact amount. It is suggested that he had some accomplices, but the Bank officials are reticent. Henderson was well connected.

His father is in the municipal service, and his wife is a member of a family of high social position.

She is left with two children, and has not heard anything of her husband since he left home with the apparent intention of going to his work in the bank.

It is supposed that Henderson blew in this money in mining stocks investments within the past two years.

Changes in Criminal Code.

OTTAWA, June 5.—The Minister of Justice proposes some changes in the criminal code. One amendment makes it unnecessary to prove in cases of certain offences against girls under sixteen that the victim was of previously chaste character.

The clause referring to the seduction of shop girls by employers is extended to include domestic servants.

Burglary is made an offence punishable by the lash.

Excitement at Washington.

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THE FILIPINOS WILL BE ATTACKED

And Cornered By the Americans.

THE CAMPAIGN TO BE CONDUCTED WITH VIGOR.

Americans Make a Forward Movement and Repulse Their Foes.

MANILA, June 5.—A vigorous campaign was begun on Saturday against General Del Pinar's force of 2,000 rebels in the foothills at the mouth of Laguna de Baya and in the town of Camataytay and Antipolo, under the supervision of General Lawton.

General Hale, with 2,500 men, has moved southwest from the pumping station and Col. Whalley, who relieved General King in command of his brigade, proceeded east from San Pedro Macar, the two divisions approaching each other.

Col. Whalley captured Cameta with a small loss, the rebels fleeing before the advance of the United States troops.

General Hale drove the Filipinos from the vicinity of Mariquina, sweeping them towards Colonel Whalley's column. The object is to corner the enemy.
