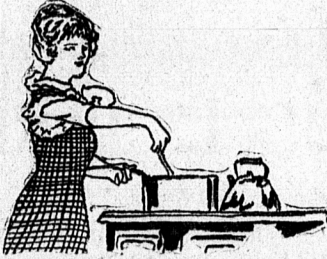

A letter received from him tells of the disaster to the transport carrying Capt. McKee and his men to France. He refers to the trip as follows: "It is quite impossible for me to tell you of our whereabouts or any of our experiences, as I have to censor my men's letters and mine must be done by a senior officer. Suffice to say we had a terrible trip from England to our landing place in France. It was so bad our ship was reported lost as we had sent the S. C. S. signal. However we pulled through. Just now we are only a few miles from the firing line and can hear the boom of the guns and at night see the flashes. We expect to be in the trenches by the time you will have received this."

**TWENTY POLES CAUGHT DRILLING.**

**TORONTO, March 28.**—Twenty Poles caught drilling in the concert hall of St. Stanislaus' Polish Church were arrested last night by city detectives. They were taken to the Clarence street police station and are being held on a charge of drilling illegally, pending further investigation into their nationality and their actions during the past six weeks. The foreigners state they are Russian Poles, but the police believe that many of them are Austrians. The suspicions of the police in this respect are partly confirmed by the fact that the commands given them by their instructor were delivered in the Polish language. This, according to Interpreter Goodwin, is contrary to the military regulations of the Russian Government, which demands that all commands be given in the Russian language. Only one of the twenty was able to produce a passport, although each states that he has a passport at his home. All the men are laborers but many have not worked for several months. The average age is about twenty-three years.

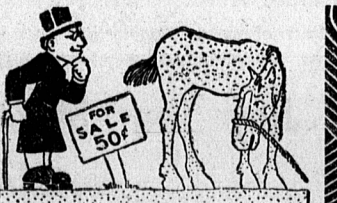

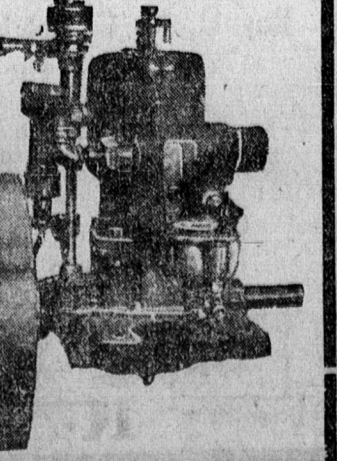
