

Mass Picketing Draws Criticism

PETERBOROUGH, Ont. (CP) — Some militant union members appear to think that union membership puts them above the law, the president of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association said here.

Humphrey B. Style, addressing the local branch of the association, said: "I might add that the impunity with which they are sometimes allowed to get away with breaking the law must certainly encourage them in such a notion."

Mr. Style was criticizing mass picketing which he said should be banned.

Those who participate in mass picketing explain it as nothing more than an innocent exercise in solidarity, the union having the undoubted right to convey information as to the existence of such a strike and to attempt to persuade employees to refrain from working, he said.

But as everyone else knows, if this was the true intention then token pickets of limited number would answer the purpose equally well.

IS HARASSMENT

"What mass picketing does do is intimidate and harass everybody and anybody who has anything to do with the company being struck. The worst part of the whole business, of course, is that the law of the land can be defied in this way. Nobody else could get away with it."

Mr. Style said until mass picketing is banned, employers will continue to seek injunctions limiting the number of pickets allowed at a plant, and if union members don't like this practice "it is for them to cease creating the conditions which make it necessary."

He said he doesn't question the right of unions to strike, but other people have rights. The employer had the right to continue production as best he could and workers had the right to continue working if they wanted to do so.

"Above all, society has the right to expect that the rights of group interests not be abused, and that liberty is not interpreted as licence. And it has both the right and the duty,

where there is such abuse, to punish the perpetrators.

HAVE LOFTY IDEALS

"The impression often created by union extremists of this stripe is that they are acting on behalf of all those who work for a living. They see themselves as zealots upholding the cause of downtrodden underdogs victimized by a callous and inhuman boss class.

"This, of course, is sheer and unadulterated rubbish and the vast body of working people in this country, organized as well as unorganized, knows it."

— Mr. Style said Canada's prosperity is "by no means an exclusive product of unionism."

Even today, fewer than three of every 10 Canadians who work were members of a labor union.

Capital Split Is Authorized

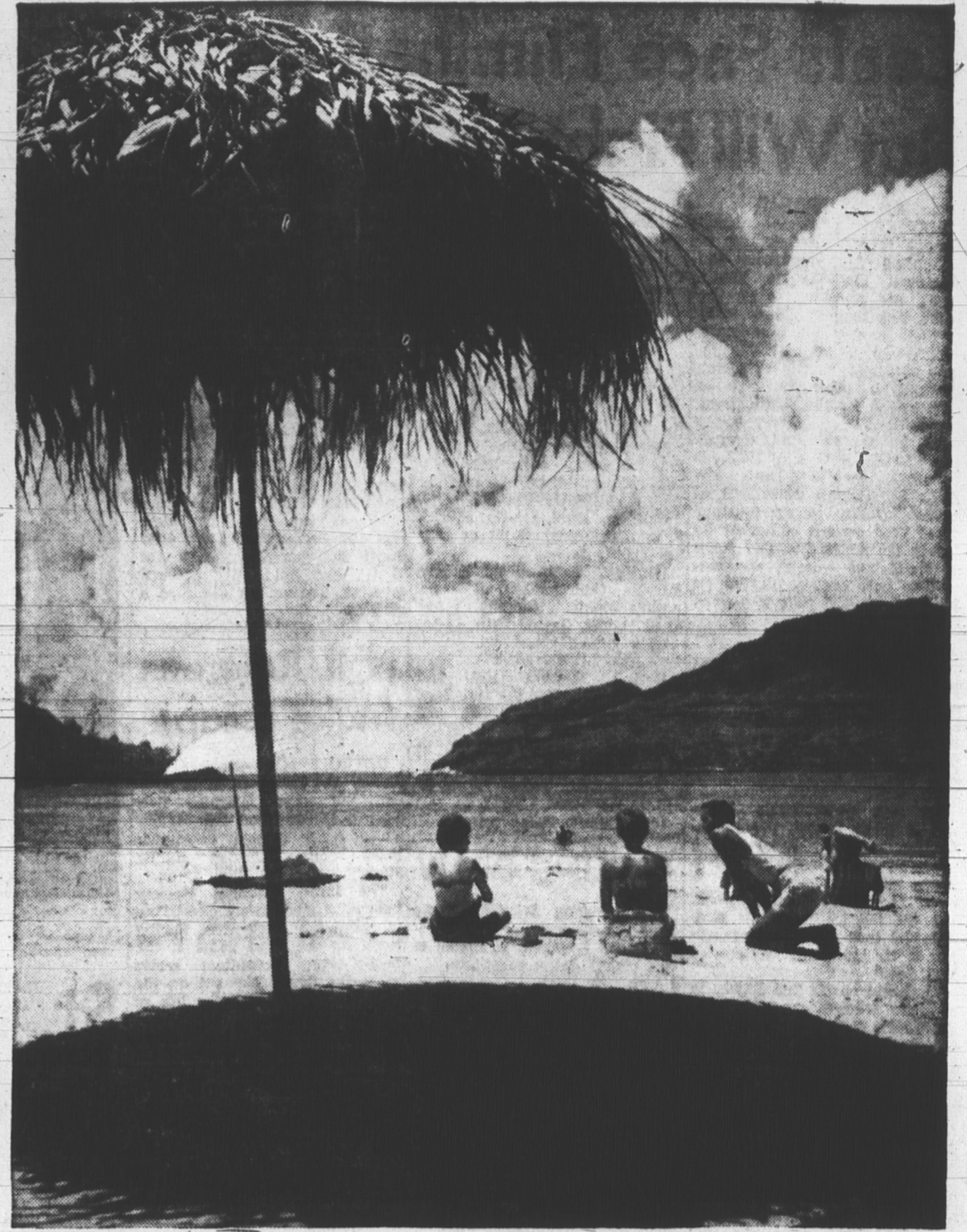
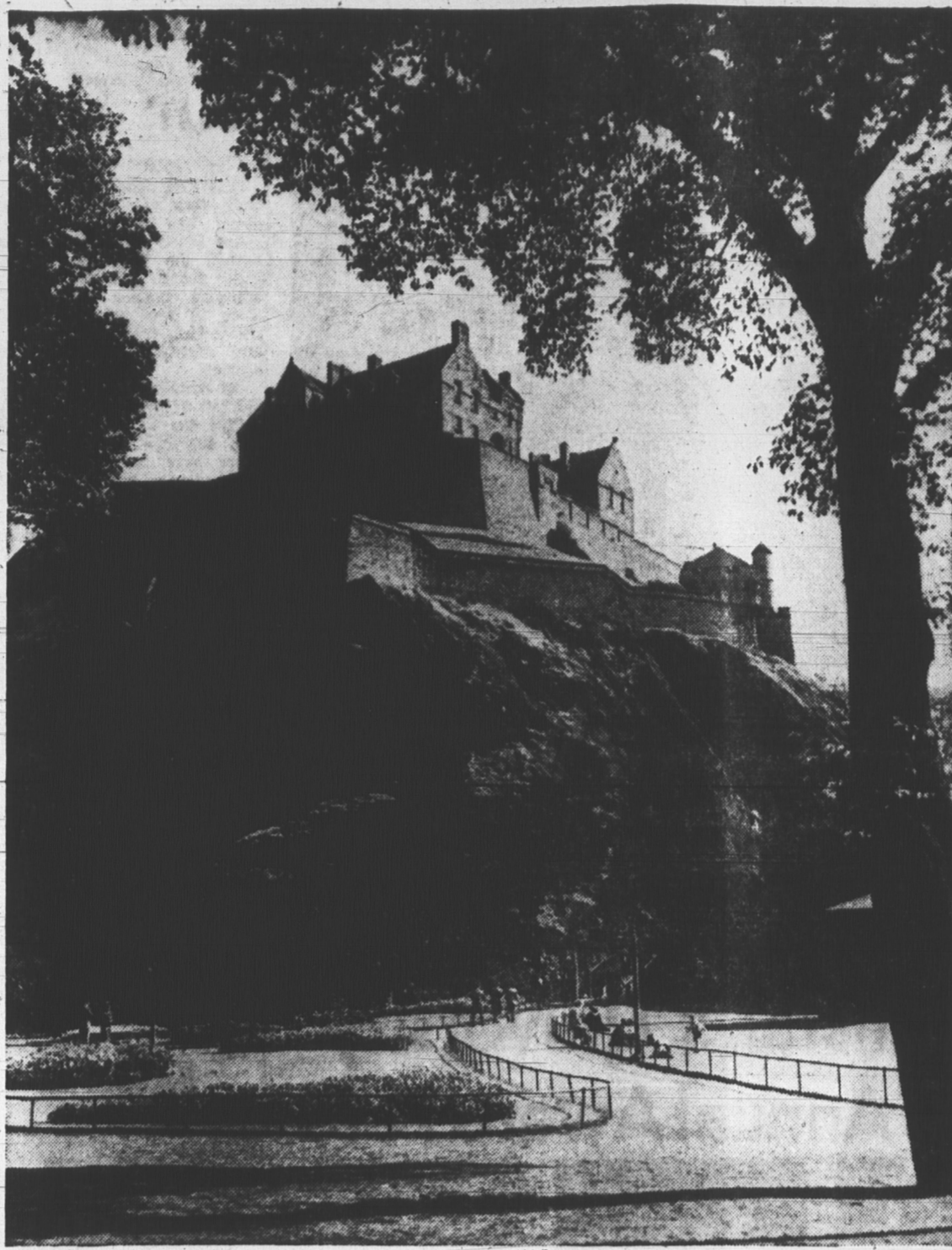
HAMILTON, Ont. (CP) —

When supplementary letters patent are granted by the secretary of state, shareholders will receive three additional shares for each share now held, John D. Campbell, president, announced.
