**Kings County Hospital Ann. Meeting Shows Progress**

A medical Board has been formed in connection with the Kings County Hospital. At the Hospital annual meeting Dr. Lorne Bonnell, Minister of Health explained the functions of such a board. It consists of Dr. McIntyre, as chief of staff with Dr. Bonnell, as secretary. The main purpose of this board being to consult with the Board of Directors concerning problems arising in connection with the hospital.

The annual meeting of the Kings County Memorial Hospital was held Thursday evening in the Beaver Club Hall, with Mr. Neil Hooley, chairman of the Board of Trustees presiding. Mr. Hooley, expressed his appreciation of the work done by the late Mrs. (Dr.) Preston McIntyre, and paid tribute to her invaluable service to the hospital. It was through her efforts, the Beaver Club was erected and became an auxiliary of the hospital. Judge J.S. DesRoches supported Mr. Hooley's remarks. In his report, he stated that a new fire escape had been added to the main building and two-thirds of the interior of the building had been redecorated, also the exterior of the building had been repainted.

Dr. Lorne Bonnell, Minister of Health, then addressed the members of the Board, concerning the relationship between the Department of Health and the hospital. Some discussion followed concerning the admittance of patients without a payment and the false idea of some, who believe that the dollar a day grant received from the government was sufficient coverage, when actually it is "not near" the amount that it costs per patient per day. It was suggested a down payment upon entering, to help defray the cost of their daily care.

**FINANCIAL REPORT**

Mr. G. Arnold Wightman then presented the financial report as follows:

Patients revenue for the year \$54,156.17; other revenue \$13,935.77; totalling \$68,091.94.

Expenses amounted to \$64,446.91, before depreciation of \$7,104.74. Deficit after allowing for depreciation \$3,459.74. Assets of the hospital for year ending 1955, \$150,975.19; Liabilities amounted to \$24,543.49 of which \$21,000.00 is the balance of the bond issue of the hospital building.

The report of the matron, Mrs. Vera MacDonald was then read and adopted.

The Ladies Auxiliary report was presented by Mrs. Ruth MacLeod. The Beaver Club report was read by Mrs. Claud MacKay, and the Nursery Club report read by Mrs. Rollie Diamond. Judge J.S. DesRoches and Mr. Leslie Hunter were re-appointed trustees for an additional three year period. Mr. Silas MacKay was appointed as the tenth member of the board representing southern Kings. Mr. Ivor Phillips was appointed auditor.
