The UPEI Computer Centre in conjunction with the Student Union is attempting to establish a videotex information system on campus this year. A video computer terminal is now located at the foot of the stairs in Robertson Library for the convenience of all passers-by.

The system is based on Telidon technology and is user interactive. A series of menu pages allows viewers to choose the information which they wish to access. Any student, faculty member, club, society, etc. who has information of interest to the university community is encouraged to use this service. News, bulletings, meetings, etc., may be indexed and placed, free of charge, at short notice. Since we are attempting to establish an up-to-date, central information source, we need the co-operation of all UPEI staff and students.
