The Dispensary Department of the Hospital, from which the poor-sick of the city obtain advice and medicine free of charge, is a great boon. Every day, between the hours of 10 and 11 o'clock, a. m., the Dispensary is visited by two physicians, who carefully attend to the wants of the sick poor.

ALL lovers of good classical music should attend the Philharmonic Society's Concert, on Tuesday evening. Judging from a practice which we had the pleasure of hearing last night, we feel confident that the audience will be delighted. The rendering of the "Soldiers' Chorus," from Gounod's Opera of Faust, will be one of the grandest things in the way of vocal music ever attempted in Charlottetown. Supreme Court.

MARCH 3, 1880.

The Supreme Court re-opened to-day to deliver judgments and hear motions for new trials, the Chief Justice, Judges Peters and Hensley on the Bench.

Robert P. Holman and Robert McCaull Stewart vs. Charles Green. This was an action of ejectment, tried before Chief Justice Palmer at Summerside, in October, 1878, when a verdict was found for the plaintiffs. A rule to set aside this verdict for a non-suit, was afterwards taken out and argued in May, 1879. Judgment of the full court was given to-day, setting aside the verdict and ordering a non-suit to be entered.

Frederick Lepage vs. the Canada Fire and Marine Insurance Company.—The rule for a new trial in this case was discharged with costs.

Annie Howlan vs. Alfred Wedge.—On motion of Mr. Hodgson, an order was made for payment of Defendant's costs, for not proceeding to trial last February term in Georgetown.

NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

Great Demonstration in St. Petersburg
OTTAWA NEWS!

Special Dispatch to the Examiner.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 2.

The city is daily decorated and the day is being observed as a general holiday in honor of the 25th anniversary of the Czar's accession. At 10 o'clock, vast crowds assembled before the Winter Palace. Troops were massed in the central quadrangle of the Palace and immediate vicinity. The programme of ceremonies heretofore announced was executed. The Czar appeared on the balcony of the Palace, where he remained twenty minutes saluting the multitude, among which there was great enthusiasm. After the Czar had received the congratulations of an enormous crowd at the Palace, he drove out in an open carriage and was loudly and continuously cheered in the crowded streets. Up to the evening no disturbances have occurred.

The report of the arrest of Vera Sassulitch proves unfounded. It is believed that the rumor of her presence in St. Petersburg was circulated purposely to mislead the authorities.

OTTAWA, March 2.

The contract for forwarding mails between San Francisco and Victoria, has been let to Goadhall, Nelson & Perkins, for \$409 per trip—three trips per month. This is a reduction of \$4,000 per annum on the original contract.

A deputation of Western members and oil refiners—the well-known ring—will shortly wait on the Minister of Inland Revenue asking that the fire test in Canadian oil be made 115 instead of 105, and on American oil from 130 to 145.

Senator Fabre took his seat yesterday. He is confident that the French duty on Canadian ships will be reduced to two francs per ton next month.
