Farm Notes.

When oats or wheat fall down before they mature, the land needs potash; apply ashes.

The more thoroughly the work is planned out ahead, the more certain it can be done in season.

Put the extra protection on the fruit and vegetable pits, and if needed, around the cellar windows and doors.

Sod land can often be ploughed when it would be entirely too wet to plough almost any other kind of ground.

Plan to secure good yields. Better a less acreage and a larger yield per acre, than a large acreage and a light yield.

Many farmers, with a little management, are able to pay running expenses, from small things that others will overlook.

One of the objections to orchard grass is its inability to grow in stony, thick seedling will in a great measure remedy this.

Because one crop has paid rather better than anything else this year, is no assurance that such will be the case the next.

By following a system of mixed farming and stock raising, better opportunity is offered of resting the land by a rotation of crops.

The more thoroughly decomposed the manure when applied, the more available it is for plant food. It will rot in the soil, however.

During the winter is a good time to haul straw, brush and rock, and fill up the gullies in the field, and prevent further washing.

One object gained in supplying plenty of bedding is that much material that is of little value as manure is converted into a good fertilizer.
