R.C.A.F. Card Still Going

TORONTO (CP)—An unsigned Christmas card with Santa Claus faded pink from his original red has crossed Canada for the seventh time in its 11-year history, holding the common memories of two RCAF families who exchange the card almost yearly.

It was received this year by Sgt. Bill Gayda in suburban Downsview from LAC Mike Comar and his family at Comox, B.C.

The card was first given by Gayda, then a corporal celebrating the first Christmas of his son Allan, to Comar, his neighbor at the Winnipeg air force base. He forgot to sign it.

Comar sent it back with the note: "Remember this?" In 1949 Gayda sent it back with the note: "Sure do—guess who?" Comar next received it in Summerside, P.E.I., and after mislaying it for a year, Gayda sent it back from Edmonton where he had been moved. By then the side and back were filled with notes but still no signature.

It has since shuttled back and forth and in 1956 was sent to Downsview. In 1957 it went to Comox, B.C., where the Comars had been posted. It has become valuable link between the families and the last two years has been sent by registered mail.

Pipeline Pays Double Taxes

OTTAWA (CP) — The Exchequer Court of Canada has ruled that some \$1,000,000 paid by the Interprovincial Pipe Line Company of Canada to the United States government in tax is not deductible from its Canadian income tax assessments.

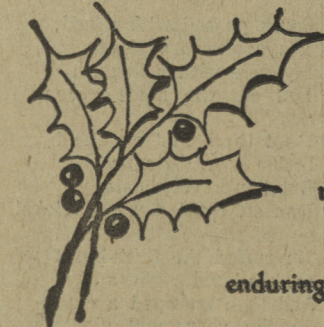
Mr. Justice A. L. Thurlow, in a 10,000 - word judgment made public Tuesday, rejected the company's appeal against the government, concluding that the American tax paid over a five-year period did not result directly from earned income in the U.S. as defined under Canada's taxing laws.

Under a Canada - U.S. agreement to avoid double taxation, a company or person paying tax in one country usually can claim this payment as a credit on tax levied in the other. Various categories of earnings are treated in different ways.

Mr. Justice Thurlow ruled that to get the tax credit, the tax paid must be on earned income involving profit. There could be no income without profit.
