Vancover Sun Sold To Winnipeg Company

VANCOUVER (CP) — Sale of controlling interest in The Sun, Vancouver's evening newspaper, to F. P. Publications of Winnipeg, was announced Saturday by Donald Cromie, president of The Sun Publishing Company Limited.

A statement issued by Mr. Cromie said "sales of sufficient voting (B) shares of Sun Publishing Company Limited to F. P. Publications of Winnipeg to raise that company's holdings to over 50 per cent have taken place recently."

Max Bell, publisher of the Calgary Alberta, is chairman of F. P. Publications and John Sifton of Winnipeg is president.

The statement said the sellers were individuals and trusts including the "Cromie family group of 20 persons."

Mr. Cromie will continue as president of Sun Publishing and publisher of the newspaper. No changes are contemplated in organization or policy.

AMOUNT SECRET

Amount involved in the switch in control was not announced but it is believed a high interest in Pacific Press Limited, which owns The Sun and The Province newspapers pooled their assets in June, 1957, when The Province let the evening field to become a morning newspaper.

Mr. Cromie's statement said that the holdings of his family members in The Sun had fallen below 50 per cent during the last two years.

Scientist Describes Pressure From Reds

LONDON (AP) — Dr. Giuseppe Martelli, an Italian-born scientist, testified here that the Russians tried for seven years to get him to spy for them or defect to the Soviet Union but he resisted them throughout. He swore he is not guilty.

Testifying in his own defence in Old Bailey Court, Martelli said the Russians used indirect threats involving his children.

Martelli is charged with being ready to spy in official language, "an act preparatory to the commission of an offence under the Official Secrets Act."

The prosecution has presented such items as follow — heeded secret codes in a letter found after his arrest April 27. His lawyer, Jeremy Hutchinson told the court Martelli accepted some of the material from Soviet agents to play for time.

Martelli said he turned down an offer from the United States two years ago to work in his special field of plasma physics, developing useful power from nuclear fusion, for fear it would make him more vulnerable to the Soviet pressure.

"It was clear to me," he said, "that I should not touch anything that was classified, that if I did my efforts to gain time would be finished."

NAMES SOVIET AGENT Nikolai Karpekov was the Soviet agent who directed the recruiting campaign. He said Karpekov was furious when he heard of Martelli's refusal to work for the U.S.

Karpekov has been identified as the Soviet contact man for William John Yassall, a British admiralty spy sentenced to prison last fall.

Martelli gave this account of his background: In 1944 he married Maria Vis, whose father was a press attaché at the Italian embassy
