CONTRACT BRIDGE

No one can expect to get consistently good scores at match-point duplicate if he is always looking for safety in the matter of opening leads. Deceptiveness is apt to be much more highly rewarded—always assuming, of course, that there is no really excellent lead at hand. Consider this deal from a match point contest:

**North dealer.**  
North-South vulnerable.

♠ K J 8  
♥ K 7 5  
♦ A K J 10 8  
♣ 6 4

♠ 3 2  
♥ Q 8 6  
♦ Q 9 3  
♣ A J 7 5

♠ 5 4  
♥ A 10 8 2  
♦ 7 6 5  
♣ Q 10 8 2

♠ A Q 10 9 7 6  
♥ J 4  
♦ 8 4  
♣ K 8

This was the bidding at every table:

North East South West  
1♣ Pass 1♠ Pass  
2♦ Pass 4♠ Pass

A five tables, the West players, seemingly with a single mind, opened a low heart, and after that their respective adversaries had an easy time of it. In every case the lead was ducked in dummy and East had to play the ace or concede the trick to South's jack. At three tables the ace was played and a club was returned, thus holding declarer to his contract. At two tables, East tried the desperation opening lead. This West with did it again, and a third time. Nothing happened. Danny ventured again. There was a click. He turned to run out and couldn't. He was a prisoner and there was nothing he could do about it. Later, Nanny came over looking for him. When Farmer Brown's boy came out in the morning he found two mice in that trap.

**Peers Clash On Russian Visit**  
LONDON (Reuters)—Protestant and Roman Catholic members of the House of Lords clashed Tuesday over the forthcoming visit to Britain next month of Russian Premier Bulganin and Communist party chief Khrushchev.

The Duke of Norfolk, the premier duke and leading British Catholic layman in Britain, said the visit of the Russian leaders is regarded with "apprehension" by British Catholics. He declared there will be no peace until freedom of worship is restored in Communist-controlled countries.

The duke added that he is "not happy that the religious question is as uppermost in the minds of our ministers as it should be."

Lord Home, secretary for Commonwealth relations, defended the Bulganin-Khrushchev visit. He said the worse the relationship the greater the need for plain speaking and "I hope this occasion will be used for some very plain speaking indeed."

Lord Alexander of Hillsborough, a former labor defence minister and president of the United Kingdom Protestant churches, said British Protestants resent the idea that it is mainly the Catholics who are concerned with religious persecution.

**ST. IGNACE, Mich. (AP)**—The body of an 86-year-old reclus, partially devoured by his 20 dogs, was found Tuesday in his one-room shack near St. Ignace. Police said Albert Newman apparently died of natural causes some time last week. Officers destroyed 13 emaciated dogs in the cabin. Seven others escaped.
