

**STUDENTSHIP COMES TO UPEI**

UPEI, this semester, saw the Department of Student Services launch a program entitled "Studentship". The Studentship program is designed to give students practical information re-do's and don't's academically while at University. Although not exclusive, the program was primarily directed toward Freshmen.

The first three sessions of the "Studentship" program were devoted to Study Skills techniques. The titles included: 1) The Lecture and You; 2) Mastering the Textbook and Reading Assignments; and 3) Studying for Tests and Exams. These sessions were presented by Marion Basha and Jack Blanchard, Counsellors in the Department of Student Services.

As well, the program included sessions on Time Management & Procrastination given by Mr. Jim Griffith, the Director of Student Services, and Mr. Micheal Hennessey, the Registrar; Getting the Most Out of Your Professor, presented by Mr. Robert Campbell, Chairman of the Dept. of English; and finally How To Study Math, conducted by Dr. Lowell Sweet of the Mathematics and Computer Science Department.

Throughout the program, the feedback was very positive and encouraging. In fact some faculty and students have strongly recommended that we offer the program early in the second semester. As yet, no decision has been made in this regard.

The Studentship concept was inaugurated in Canada by Mr. Ken Long, Dean of Students at the University of Windsor. Through the persistent effort of Jim Griffith, in consultation with Ken Long, Studentship became a reality at U.P.E.I. We owe a debt of gratitude both to Ken and Jim, to our

presenters, and to all Faculty and Administrative Staff who supported the program.

The program is unique and meaningful and this has certainly been borne out in the testimonies of the students who have experienced it.
