A Strong Speech Added to the Debate—An Ingenious Plan Proposed for Adoption in Lieu of Cartwright's Scheme—The Universities to Elect Senators.

OTTAWA, June 5.—(Special)—Senator Ferguson added a strong speech to the debate on Senate Reform today. In his mind the chief faults in the present conditions were the unequal division of the parties.

Senators in proportion to the voting strength of his party preceding a general election, the party having disproportionate representation to be given all nominations until a fair start is obtained.
