Gold and base metals were lightly traded. Most early losses were recovered. Among golds, Hollinger slipped 1/2 at 2 1/2 and Lake Shore was down 10 cents at \$4.90. In mines Gunnar lost 1/2 point at 16 1/2 and White Amulet dipped 10 cents at \$5.90. On the upside were Labrador, Noranda, and Sleep Rock.

Find Cave Once Dedicated To The Great God Pan

ATHENS (AP) — Near the windy Marathon Plain where the ancient Greeks fought one of their most famous battles, a laborer not long ago stumbled onto a cave.

His discovery turned out to be a long-lost cave dedicated to the worship of the shaggy, goat-legged god Pan. And the laborer was perhaps the first human inside it for as long as 18 centuries.

Archaeologists think it may prove a sensational discovery because of the significance of objects found in the rubble, dating back 5,000 years.

There is no doubt Pan was worshipped there. An inscription on a marble slab records the fact in fifth-century B.C. Greek.

The cave is located on the hillside four miles from the site of the Battle of Marathon, fought in 490 B.C. There the ancient Greeks, who believed they were fighting with divine help from Pan, defeated the Persians and preserved their homeland from foreign bondage.

Archaeologists knew that a cave sacred to Pan existed somewhere along the edge of the Marathon Plain in Attica. Mention of it had been made in an early guide-book containing descriptions by a Greek traveller, Pausanias in the 2nd century A.D.

One day a couple of months ago, a laborer saw a fox vanish through a tunnel on the northern slope of a hill. Curious, he decided to see where it led.

After crawling through the tunnel in pitch darkness for about 60 feet, he switched on his flashlight. The sight that met his eyes sent him scurrying to Athens to report his find to Prof. John Papadimitriou, inspector of Attica antiquities.

It did not take Papadimitriou long to ascertain that it was none other than the long-lost cave of Pan.

The cave fits Pausanias' description like a glove. It has two big chambers connected by a long narrow corridor. Its pale, weirdly spaced stalaetite and stalagmite formations look like goat herds of Pan, as Pausanias wrote. In places where the stalactites join the stalagmites, recesses are formed. These recesses Pausanias called baths, presumably because of the dripping stalactites.

The cave has a ceiling of blue and green marble. Its over-all length exceeds 300 feet. A leading Greek authority on caves says it must have been formed a million years ago.

"This lends startling support to a myth reported by Herodotus in connection with the resumption of the worship of the god Pan after the Battle of Marathon," says Papadimitriou.

The Greek historian, Herodotus, who lived in the 5th century B.C., and recorded the myths of his day, has related his contemporaries' belief in the decisive role played by Pan in that battle.

On the eve of the battle, so Herodotus says, the Athenians sent the runner Phidippides to Sparta with a desperate call for help.

The Spartans were unable to send help immediately. But Phidippides did not come back empty-handed. He brought back an offer of help from Pan.

As he was crossing the Mountains of Arcadia, Phidippides said, he ran into Pan. The pipe-playing deity assured him he was still very fond of the Athenians and would soon give them ample proof of his affection.

"But," Phidippides reported Pan as saying, "I have a grudge against you Athenians. Why don't you worship me any more?"

Phidippides' encounter with Pan was interpreted by the Athenian warriors as a good omen and they went into battle with great zest and fury.

Pan kept his word. At the height of the battle, he appeared to the Persians. His countenance spread terror in their ranks. Terror has come to be known as "panic," after the god who provoked it.

Crazy about planes as a boy, George "Buzz" Beurling became Canada's leading fighter ace in World War II. In five months action on Malta he shot down 29 planes. Beurling survived the war only to die in a 1948 crash on his way to fight for Israel.
