Leafs, Wings, Canadiens Win Saturday Games

TORONTO, (CP)—A two-goal repeat performance by leftwinger Gordie Hannigan Saturday night gave Toronto Maple Leafs a 6-0 victory over the last-place Chicago Black Hawks in a National Hockey League game. The 24-year-old Hannigan scored his first two goals of the season in Montreal last Thursday and within 46 seconds Saturday night he got his third and fourth. Hawks lost rightwinger Ike Hildebrand in the second period when he suffered a fractured leg after tripping over Leafs' Eric Nesterenko and crashing into the boards. Harry Watson, leading Leaf scorer, counted his 19th of the season. Other scorers were Sid Smith, George Armstrong and Ron Stewart.

BOSTON, (CP)—Metro Prystai scored two goals as Detroit Red Wings crowded all their goals into an eight-minute section of the second period to defeat Boston Bruins 4-2 Saturday night in a National Hockey League game here. It was the seventh straight victory for Detroit over Boston. The league-leading Red Wings did it the hard way, coming from behind after Boston had taken a two-goal lead on rookie Doug Mohns' first-period tally and Cal Gardner's second-period score. Prystai opened the Detroit scoring at 7:19 of that period. He got his second at 12:44 then defenseman Red Kelly tallied at 13:46 and finally Glen Skov clinched it with a 30-footer at 15:04. Ted Lindsay picked up two assists for the Red Wings.
