

International League To Begin Schedule Tuesday

MONTREAL, (CP)—The International Baseball League Tuesday will start its 154-game schedule, with teams in three countries.

There are two new teams. Cuban Sugar Kings and Richmond Virginians will make their debut when the circuit begins its 71st season. The IL boasts of being the first three-country league and will do 75 per cent of its travelling by air.

"They don't call us the International League for nothing," said IL president Frank Shaughnessy, referring to the entry of Cuba in the circuit which hitherto comprised United States and Canadian teams.

"We're going to have a real good interesting league. Havana and Richmond did a good job of getting organized, but of course we won't know the full story until we see them in action."

Canadian Bun Cook Most Successful Coach In AHL

CLEVELAND, (AP)—A stocky soft-spoken, middle-aged Canadian has finished his 10th season slouching on the bench of the American Hockey League's Cleveland Barons, who won their second straight Calder trophy last week.

With his head nearly resting on the sideboards, coach Frederick Joseph (Bun) Cook literally sweats through each play, and sometimes slaps his hand against the boards to attract the players' attention.

From his prezel position he shouts instructions from the bench in an effort that sometimes costs him a voiceless day or two. But in the dressing room or in practice he rarely goes above a low-pitched tone spoken in a searching manner.

Works Out With Team

Sometimes, in practice sessions, 50-year-old Cook works out with the boys, and afterwards, is almost always heard to say: "I can't figure out, why I get tired so quickly."

With seven AHL championships to his credit—two in Providence and five in Cleveland—Cook is the most successful coach in the league.

He started coaching at Providence in 1937, after many years at left wing on the National Hockey League's New York Rangers, where, with his brother Bill at right wing and Frank Boucher at centre, he participated in what was perhaps hockey's all-time greatest line.

From a farm on the plains of Saskatchewan, Cook played on local teams until the mid-twenties. His last amateur teammates in Canada were the Saskatoon Shieks.

Now, with his wife, Marie, who came from Preston, Minn., Cook runs a farm about six miles from Kingston, Ont. His three sons and two daughters range in age from 10 to 23.

Start From Scratch

Back each year, often after losing some of his key players to National League squads, he usually has to start manufacturing his team almost from scratch.

Cook prefers to ponder strategy, while leaving his players to work out their faults by themselves. When he steps in, he does so lightly.

"Let's get one more goal than they get," is his favorite pre-game cliché. If the contest turns out to be a loser, Cook lingers into the dressing room and says quietly: "Well, we can't win 'em all. Let's get 'em the next time."
