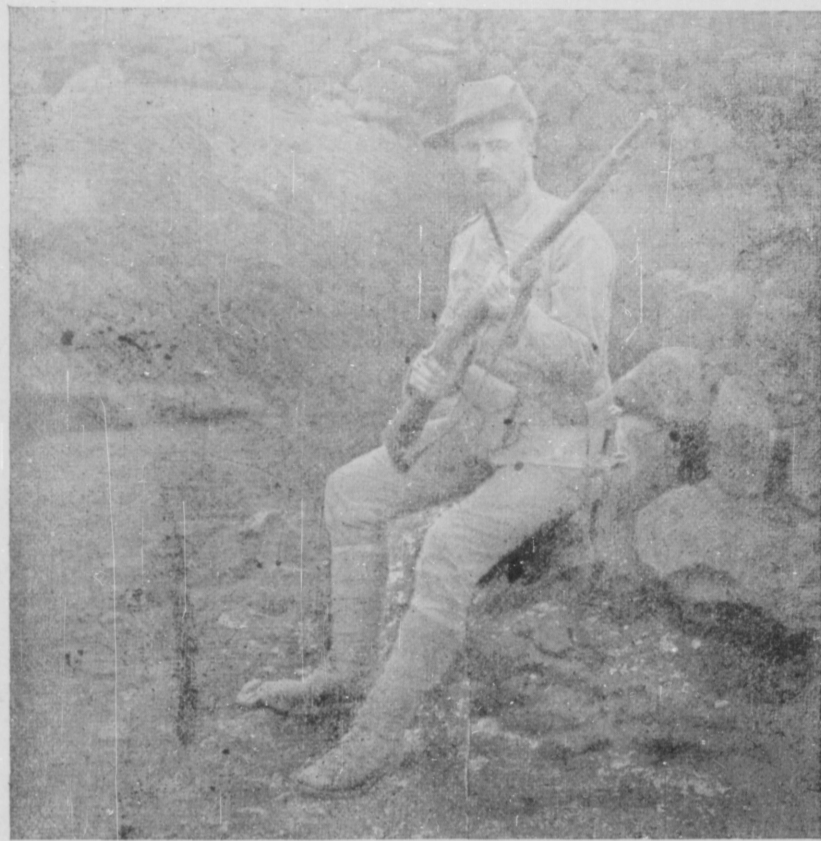

THE ADVANCE TO PRETORIA

BOERS RETIRING FROM THE BIGGARSBERG RANGE.

Inactivity of the British Apparently at an End.

Movements of British Troops kept from the Press—Telegrams from the Orange Free State are Carefully Censored—Lord Roberts' Spion Kop Despatch—Boer Promotions.

THE FORWARD MOVEMENT.

LONDON, April 21.—Two important statements pointing strongly to the probability that Lord Roberts' advance to Pretoria has already begun come from the field of war.

According to a despatch from Ladysmith, it is authoritatively reported there that the Boers are retiring from the Biggarsberg range with their heavy ordnance.

Probably they have heard of Lord Roberts' advance and are naturally anxious to make sure of their line of retreat, or they may propose to take up a more easily defended position, allowing

part of the force to be transferred to the army in the Free State. From this movement of the Boers, adds the correspondent, it would appear that General Buller will go forward simultaneously with Lord Roberts, and that the forced inactivity of the vast army at Bloemfontein is now at an end.

The other fact tending to the same deductions is that telegrams from the Orange Free State are severely censored, not a word being allowed to reach the press respecting the movements of the troops.

NO NEWS FROM THE FRONT.

CAPE TOWN, April 21.—The officer controlling the censorship has notified correspondents of the practical suspension of all telegrams during the operations now begun.

VICTORIA CROSS.

LONDON, April 21.—The Gazette announces that the Queen has conferred the Victoria Cross on Major William Babbie, of the army medical corps, for conspicuous bravery at the battle of Colenso.

BOER PROMOTIONS.

PRETORIA, April 21.—Major General Schalkburgher has been gazetted Vice-President in succession to the late General Jonbert, and General Louis Botha has been gazetted acting commandant succeeding General Jonbert in command of the Transvaal forces.

GENERAL WHITE.

LONDON April 21.—General White, if not required in South Africa, will go as

Governor of Gibraltar toward the end of May.

HEAVY FIGHTING

ACCRA April 21.—Heavy fighting is reported in progress near Kumasi.

THE REASON WHY.

LONDON, April 21.—The Government's reason for publishing Lord Roberts' Spion Kop despatch was explained last evening at Hull by Walter Hume Long, President of the Board of Agriculture, who said that the country was entitled to receive all the information the Government could give.

The Government is told, continued Mr. Long, that having published the despatch it is bound to deal immediately with the Generals affected. But in following such a course the Government might have to dismiss every General the moment he made a mistake. Had such a policy been pursued in the past many of the most glorious deeds would not have been performed.

The Government used its discretion in publishing the despatches.

From the beginning of the campaign Her Majesty's Ministers have not swerved from the rule of leaving the conduct of operations to the discretion and judgment of the commander-in-chief.

AT WEPENER.

LONDON, April 21.—General Chermiside and General Buller are moving over the sodden roads, rain was still falling when they went into camp on Thursday afternoon, eighteen miles west of Dewit's Dorp.

They hold the railway and the southern frontier of the Free State with 20,000 men.

How many are going with the Generals who will engage the Boers at Wepener is not mentioned in the latest despatches from Orlogspoort where the British bivouacked Wednesday night. The field telegraph ends there. On Thursday the Boers had Colonel Dalgety closely penned.
