President Tito Levels Blast At Red China

BELGRADE (AP)—Yugoslav President Tito has accused China of playing power politics with the aim of assuming a decisive role in the international scene.

The Yugoslav leader, 72, in apparent good health, launched his charges at the opening session of the eighth congress of his Communist Party. From this blast he turned to some kind words for deposed Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev.

Tito's speech took up the whole morning session of the congress, attended by 1,500 Yugoslav delegates and 200 from other Communist parties. Delegations from China and its ally, Albania, were not invited.

The congress will continue Tuesday.

Gift Reprimand Given Youngster For Hitching Ride

In City Court yesterday Magistrate James Haslam, QC, gave one of the stiffest reprimands heard in the court for sometime to a youngster for stealing a ride by hanging onto a moving car.

The youngster was also fined \$10 and costs.

The Magistrate termed it a "most serious" matter and said if the youngster doing it were injured it was always the motorist who was blamed for the accident. He said the practice of youngsters of "hitching" rides "has to be stopped and we are going to stop it now. It cannot go on any longer."

In assessing the fine Magistrate Haslam also warned the boy to "tell your friends that this is not a maximum fine by any means and if you come back into this court again the fine will be a great deal more."

The gifts will be wrapped by White Cross volunteers before going on to make a cheerful Christmas a more cheerful one for those who are confined, through illness, to be parted from their families on Christmas Day.

Lady Beaverbrook of "Dayspring" St. Andrew's, N.S., has consented to be the honorary national chairman of the 1964 Christmas program.

In her program message Lady Beaverbrook urged all people to donate something to brighten the lives of thousands of Canadians who are battling mental illness and will be obliged to spend Christmas in various mental institutions throughout the nation, deprived of that special happiness that comes only from being home with loved ones and friends.

She said, "the Christmas gift program is designed to permit Canadians to share a small portion of their good fortunes with those who need to be reassured that they are not forgotten. Christmas is a time of giving. It is a time for giving."

Warning Given On Unnecessary Adornments

Yesterday Crown Prosecutor Alan Scates called three witnesses. Tom Constable Johannes Plomp of the Borden Police, testified to entering the residence of the accused, accompanied by his brother, also of Borden. He purchased a pint of liquor from the accused, which he later turned over to Cpl. W. A. Wilson of the RCMP who had provided him with a marked five dollar bill to make the purchase.
