

## Hold Successful School Track And Field Meet

A large crowd of parents and children attended the Island's 8th annual inter-scholastic track and field meet held at Memorial Field on Saturday afternoon.

John Kane, a representative from Queen Street School, was top individual point getter of the event as he captured three trophies, one for 1st place in the 100 yard dash for boys 15 years and over, another for winning the 100 yard open and the third for being first in the 12-pound shot put.

The girls 100 yard open was won by Irene Parkman, followed in second place by Aurelia Gauthier from Stella Maria School, North Rustico. In the boys running high jump, John MacGowan, Kilmuir, topped the bar at 5 feet 1 inch while Mary Milligan reached a height of 4 feet 3 1/2 inches in the girls event. Sterling Pasha of P.W.C. won the 440 yard dash in one minute and two-fifths seconds while Don Rogers of Summerside High took first place in the 880 yard dash.

High won the one mile bike race as D. Mallett and Billy Milligan staged a great race for second and third positions. Keith Warren from Queen Charlotte High sprinted very well in the last half of the mile race to win in the record time of 5 minutes 45 1/2 seconds. He was followed closely by John MacGowan. Queen Square School won the 1/2 mile. In the 8 year old boys 50 yard dash, Gordon MacKay tied twice with Wayne Flynn before he was able to capture first place in the event.

## Moncton Players Win Titles At P.E.I. Open Golf Meet

Amateur Roy Morrison from the Moncton Golf and Country Club yesterday won the first Prince Edward Island Open golf championship by defeating co-club member Alan Ogilvie by two strokes with a 72 in the second round yesterday morning.

Ogilvie was champ in the pro as he beat out Charlottetown pro, Cecil Dowling by five strokes, four of which he gained on the last round yesterday afternoon. Cecil's brother, M. J. Dowling from Moncton was second to Morrison in the championship division.

A beautiful fall week-end helped make the Island's and one of the Maritime's biggest golf tournaments a complete success. One hundred and twenty-seven golfers from many parts of the Maritimes teed-off on the rolling fairways of Belvedere Course in competition for the high-valued amount of prizes and prize money at stake.

In the opening round on Saturday, Ogilvie stroked a 74 on the 18-hole course, followed by Cecil Dowling with 75 and Jim Walker with 76. In the second round which was played on Sunday morning, Ogilvie held his one stroke lead over Dowling as both finished the round with 75. Jim Walker fell far back with an 80. In the third and final round played yesterday afternoon, the Moncton pro matched his second round score to become champion pro as Dowling fell back with a 79.

In the championship division, Roy Morrison, who was trailing Mousie Dowling by one stroke at the end of 36 holes, came from behind in the third and took the Open and Amateur championships with a 75 for the round as compared with Dowling's 80. Morrison had a 75-72-75 for the tournament while Dowling had 74-72-80.

A large crowd was on hand to cheer the men on in the final stages late in the afternoon. On Saturday evening a driving competition won by Roy Morrison, and a dance at the club house were held. Last evening the prizes were presented by Mr. A. G. MacMillan.
